# Inglewood Ladies Rest Rooms Upgrade (Anthea Brown)

NEW ZEALAND The Inglewood Ladies Rest Rooms RED CROSS and Plunket Rooms were in the fund raising and planning stages RIPEKA WHERO AOTEAROA from 1935 and were finally built as

a Centennial Memorial in 1940 with money raised by a Ladies committee with help from both the Inglewood Borough and County councils. In

1972 the Red Cross Rooms were added thanks to a Inglewood RSA public appeal. Now 75 years after being built they are getting a major upgrade to again best serve the community.

After a long time of planning and arranging funding it has been a very quick start to the renovations at the rooms.



These long awaited renovations started on Monday 19 June and the 8-12 week project will maintain the original exterior of the building but a rearranged internal floor plan will enable both Plunket and the Red Cross to better meet the current needs of their clients. It is an exciting development that will include accessible toilet facilities, and a 26 m2 meeting room that will be available for hire to other groups in the community.

While the build is on, Inglewood Plunket Clinics are continuing as booked. Plunket didn't get a chance to let many of their clients know before it started and wish to advise that they have temporary premises in a room

New Zealand Golf has just awarded


