The Inglewood Ladies Rest Rooms and Plunket Rooms were in the fund raising and planning stages from 1935 and were finally built as a Centennial Memorial in 1940 with money raised by a Ladies committee with help from both the Inglewood Borough and County councils. In 1972 the Red Cross Rooms were added thanks to a Inglewood RSA public appeal. Now 75 years after being built they are getting a major upgrade to again best serve the community.

The Fire brigades across New Zealand have been turning out to these incidents for a long time but they were only partially covered in the old legislation.

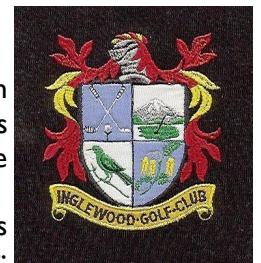
New Zealand Golf has just awarded Inglewood



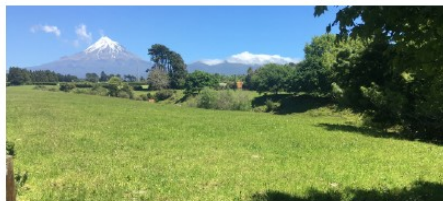
