

Experience Purangi News (Karen Schumach Bird survey results. Late last year we worked with Taranaki Regional

Bird survey results. Late last year we worked with Taranaki Regional Council staff on a 5-minute brical law survey within our project area. We were hopeful that the survey would show a marked difference between the area where we have intensive trapping compared to the wider project area; and it did!

Our "Rokinko core block has over 800 x24" rat raps in place along with 340 A12 possum traps plus of course our DOC-200 stoat traps.
