Garden Clues with Sue (Sue Marsh)

HAMMER Springtime, the most anticipated time after a long winter, in fact it really hasn't been too bad at all here in Taranaki, but nevertheless, still a great reason to get back into our gardens. There are always products and plants on the market to entertain, tools to make our life easier, or projects that just say 'pick me, and let's do this'. Let's look at one option this week, and that is to extend go kit set raised planters, which is the ultimate easy way to expand your gardening space, maybe even get you started on your first garden.

New in garden are GardenStax kisnet gardens, you can create a raised garden bed in just minutes! Quick and easy to install, GardenStax can be assembled to any height or shape that suits you, taking the back-breaking work of gardening. Create a garden anywhere, use as a vegetable garden, flower bed, compost bin, sandpit, or as a base for your greenhouse – the options are endless. Install them straight on the ground, on a pallet, or a wheeled base. To install simply hammer the pin into the joining brackets to connect the sides in the shape you desire. Stack layers on top by securing the lugs onto the layer below to create the height you are after, then fill as required. We recommend inserting a weed mat at the base of the GardenStax to prevent weeds from taking over your new plants. Available in either black or natural, one layer will require approximately three bags of compost, or a mixture of compost/soil or your favourite growing medium... and of course plants to grow! This is an excellent project for your children to get involved with, and you may just be instilling in them the love of gardening, after all -you're never too young to start in the garden.

There are generally plenty of seeds back in store, as suppliers catch up, and if you prefer to grow from seed, then there are lots of options of using jiffy and peat pots, as well as jiffy pellets, all which can be planted out once your plants have germinated and have hardened off. Just keep them in a nice warm place to germinate, and once the weather warms up, you'll be ready for outdoor planting. Happy gardening!

Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week (Graham Walker)

Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week is set for Sunday 13 to Saturday 19 of September and to correspond with this the Taranaki MS Society Inc. plan to hold their street appeal on Friday and Saturday of this week. It is estimated that 140 people in Taranaki have been diagnosed with the progressive neurological disease that is Multiple Sclerosis although an exact figure is unknown. MS is considered an auto-immune disease and is a result of an over active immune system attacking the central nervous system, that's the nerves of the brain and spine. The range of symptoms of MS is huge and speed of progression is completely unpredictable, a situation that means that no two people with the complaint appear the same. Woman are more likely to be diagnosed than men and unfortunately, the age group often hit is 25 to 35 years although paediatric onset is not unknown. A point to note is that for every person diagnosed their family is also hugely affected by the consequences.

Care for MS patients in the provinces lags way behind the main centres on many fronts and for this reason alone the importance of the local Society employing a visiting nurse/educator/ social worker as a Field Worker is paramount. The budget for the service supplied is badly underfunded by the Ministry of Health meaning that 80% of the spend comes from fundraising grants, etc.

Your local MS Society is very grateful to Phil Hind of New World Inglewood and the Inglewood Lions for enabling and manning a collection point at our local supermarket on Friday 18 September.

Community Board News (Moi Cook)

There has been a flurry of activity in the past month by the Board as they try to finalise submissions for projects, plans and aspirations to be included in the Long Term Plan, whilst at the same time trying to complete the Community Plan.

As part of both of these objectives the Board met with Council Officers at the swimming pool recently to discuss the proposal for shading to be installed around the pool surrounds. It was a good, positive meeting and the proposal was received well. The Board were told that the pool has substantial leaks and to remedy this, a pool liner will be installed for this summer.

Later that day the Board was presented with a proposal by the Open Spaces Planning Team to develop the Trimble Hill-Joe Gibbs Walkway, which

is a series of tracks providing up to 46m of routes through bush and open spaces with picnic tables along the way. Funding is available and it is planned that the works will be carried out this coming summer.

Closing out the day with the Officers, the Board assembled at an alternative proposed site where the erection of the giant Moa sculpture might be sited, instead of Trimble Hill. The small reserve area on Matai Street to the southern end of the Railway Yards was thought to be perfect spot by the Planning Officers, as it offers much greater visibility and presence. Work continues on this project by the Moa Project Team lead by Karen Morait. The Community Plan is all but finalised and will soon be put to Council for approval and are hopeful that the Long-Term Plan submissions make it through unscathed!

SPCA cannot take wild cats and voluntary shelters are over run constantly. Kittens the mothers give birth to, away from home, often have to be caught in traps and have to be put down because they are wild if they are not of an age where they may be able to be socialised and rehomed.

It costs around \$145 to get a female spayed and \$100 for a male. Please if you can't afford this cost don't get a kitten.
