**Indemic Awarded TSB Bank Good Stuff Grant**  
(Nick Jones)  
Local product design consultancy Indemic has been awarded the TSB Bank Good Stuff grant - a funding pool that TSB Bank developed in response to the Covid-19 crisis, with a desire to help aspiring entrepreneurs get ideas off the ground and create new business and social enterprise opportunities. Nick Jones, co-director of Indemic alongside partner Emma Boyd, is extremely grateful for the support TSB has afforded their business, along with eight other award recipients nationwide. They have been in development of a new humane animal trap primarily targeting ferrets, a considerable mammalian pest in New Zealand - particularly in our farmland and open-country environments. Ferrets are one of the most difficult animals to humanely target and kill, and the traps will work effectively on all other small mammalian pests in New Zealand. The trap has been in serious development for two years, with Nick undertaking humane animal testing at Lincoln University in order to ensure the trap performs well and animals don't suffer unnecessarily. The design has gone through many prototypes and iterations, field testing with Taranaki Kiwi Trust, and significant support and assistance from other conservation groups, local engineering companies as well as support from Venture Taranaki. "Developing physical products is a demanding exercise, especially when you involve animals, harsh environments and a desire to create a very reliable product with a long lifespan." The grant will allow Nick to focus on the project full-time, finalising all of the design elements and undertaking a significant program of tooling, as well as setting up a manufacturing and production space. Indemic is a business focused on innovation, developing physical products for many manufacturing companies around New Zealand and overseas, as well as inventors wishing to develop new ideas. They operate out of the former Underwood Engineering factory here in Inglewood, and will be hoping to start full production of their trap from the factory early next year, revivifying local manufacturing and creating new jobs. "It's an exciting time for our business, and we feel very fortunate to be able to undertake this work here in Inglewood and bring back manufacturing once more".

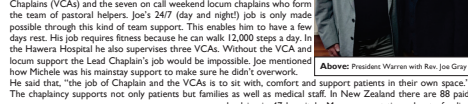
**Taranaki Emergency Services Ball**

**Rotary Supports Chaplaincy** (Bob Francisco)  
The Rev. Joe Gray, the Lead Chaplain at Taranaki Base Hospital, began his talk to Rotary by saying, "One day all is well, and then the next day we wind up in hospital." It's a common experience for so many of us and our whanau.  
Joe's wife Michele and four children lived on Hursthouse Road in a rural setting (along with their beloved animals) back in the 1990s. He then worked in Inglewood managing the pool. He then shifted to Australia to work as a minister, as well as being a chaplain for a surf lifesaving club and a rugby union team. This well suited Joe's lifesaving and sporting background.  
He described his work and that of the 22 trained Volunteer Assistant Chaplains (VACAs) and the seven on call weekend locum chaplains who form the team of pastoral helpers. Joe's 24/7 (day and night) job is only made possible through this kind of team support. This enables him to have a few days rest. His job requires fitness because he can walk 12,000 steps a day in the Hawera Hospital he also supervises three VCA's. Without the VCA's and locum support the Lead Chaplain's job would be impossible. Joe mentioned how Michele was his mainstay support to make sure he didn't overwork. He said that, "the job of Chaplains and the VCA's is to sit with, comfort and support patients in their own space." The chaplaincy supports not only patients but families as well as medical staff. In New Zealand there are 88 paid chaplains in 47 hospitals. Many are part-time, due to funding issues, and do their job out of dedication and self-sacrifice. Chaplaincy inclusively cares for all patients whatever their religion or belief system. Joe mentioned that chaplaincy is not a religious work, but it does have interdenominational church and spiritual sponsorship under the Inter Church Hospital Chaplaincy (IHC). He mentioned that he will express a spirituality in terms of how we respect and treat each other and our earth.  
Lastly, Joe explained that our Annual Chaplaincy Awareness Week is September 21-27 at New Plymouth and Hawera Hospitals and left us posters for the big fundraising ANNUAL GIANT PLANT SALE on Saturday, September 26 at St. Andrew's Church Hall in New Plymouth from 8.00am-12.00pm. If you can donate any seedling plants, gardening gear, books or bric-a-brac bring them along at 8.00am September 26. The proceeds go to programmes such as Family Violence, Youth Suicide Prevention and initiatives for the hospital staff. Funding is currently an issue and Chaplaincy hopes to raise \$4,000 at the GIANT PLANT SALE through your supportive contributions and generosity.  
While hospital and medical staff look after how you are, the Chaplain and VCA's look after who you are - often in a time of need or crisis. Nga manaakitanga blessings
