Fifty students from 27 colleges and one home schooled student were sponsored by 24 Rotary Clubs and all the students arrived at Vertical Horizon camp on Friday night not knowing each other. All were very quiet and somewhat timid. Between Friday night and lunchtime Sunday, things changed! Best Friends Forever and "I'll miss you" to "the weekend should be longer" were all phrases in abundance as everyone departed after Sunday lunch. Cooking marshmallows over the campfire on Saturday night was a hit, as were the two guest speakers. The course theme for the weekend was "Be bold, be brave" and this was very much in evidence when Friday night guest speaker Paul Rangiwahia challenged the students to think about themselves when he spoke about mindfulness and looking after your mental health. Lake Taupo, Flying Kiwi, the Raft Race and the Mud Run were all physical and mental challenges, then came Sunday's guest speaker Jamie Turner, whose theme was "Expand the Edges" which was another way to conquer the challenges when fear, bullying, embarrassment and a lack of confidence come your way.

The evaluation forms all had two things in common, the macaroni cheese for lunch on Saturday wasn't hugely popular and, the course should be a week, not a weekend! The warm letters and emails from students, parents and teachers have made RYPEN 2021 highly rewarding for all the Inglewood Rotarians and we know that we have changed the lives of several young men and women, which is why we do what we do. Planning is already underway for 2022.

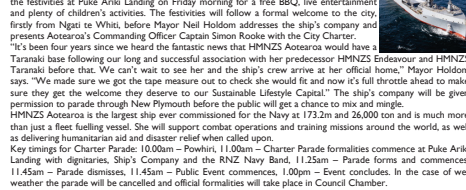


**First Working Bee for Restore PG Nops for 2021** (Lugh Hemon)

**HMNZS Aotearoa To be Welcomed To Her Home Port**  
A massive welcome awaits the Navy's biggest and most high-tech ship HMNZS Aotearoa this week for her first ever visit to her home port in New Plymouth. To celebrate the arrival of the half a billion dollar vessel, the public are invited to join the festivities at Puke Ariki Landing on Friday morning for a formal BBQ, live entertainment and plenty of children's activities. The festivities will follow a formal welcome to the city, firstly from Ngati te Whiri, before Mayor Neil Holdon addresses the ship's company and presents Aotearoa's Commanding Officer Captain Simon Rooke with the City Charter. "It's been four years since we heard the fantastic news that HMNZS Aotearoa would be visiting Taranaki base following our long and successful association with her predecessor HMNZS Endeavour and HMNZS Taranaki before that. We can't wait to see her and the ship's crew arrive at her official home," Mayor Holdon says. "We made sure we got the tape measure out to check she would fit and now it's full throttle ahead to make sure they get the welcome they deserve to our Sustainable Lifestyle Capital." The ship's company will be given permission to parade through New Plymouth before the public will get a chance to mix and mingle. HMNZS Aotearoa is the largest ship ever commissioned for the Navy at 173.2m and 26,000 ton and is much more than just a fleet fueling vessel. It will support combat operations and training missions around the world, as well as delivering humanitarian aid and disaster relief when called upon. Key timings for Charter Parade: 10.00am - Powhiri, 11.00am - Charter Parade formalities commence at Puke Ariki Landing with dignitaries, Ship's Company and the RNZ Navy Band, 11.25am - Parade forms and commences, 11.45am - Parade dismisses, 11.45am - Public Event commences, 1.00pm - Event concludes. In the case of wet weather the parade will be cancelled and official formalities will take place in Council Chamber.

### Durham WI Visit Dolly's Milk Farm

Our early evening visit to Dolly's Milk Farm on Manutahi Road provided the Durham WI group with many a chuckle and several surprises. Owner Kevin Death was a welcoming and informative host. Most of us were familiar with a milking shed environment and could visualise what the usual once a day milking activity might look and sound like. At the time of our visit, the main bovine activity occurring in the actual shed area was young calves lingering around the calf feeder. They are reared on the days excess milk. In an adjacent paddock, we were able to observe the milking herd of 40 jersey cross cows grazing calmly in the company of resident Speckled Park bull, Otis. The cows were curious about our presence but one continued to lick the side of Otis' substantial white neck.

In the main shop area, just in front of the milking shed, is a vending machine dispensing chilled raw milk. A variety of other fresh local produce was on offer and also proved popular with the steady stream of after-work customers. Most people came with containers to be refilled and their own chilly bags for safe transportation. You could see they were experienced at inserting their pre-loaded Dolly's cards in the slot and pushing the right buttons. We all liked the option of the glass bottles which were also available for purchase. One topic of discussion surrounded theories about how the name 'Dolly' was acquired with the obvious Dolly Parton connection being strongly favoured. Kevin was kind enough to offer us the opportunity to sample the fresh unpasteurised milk and entertained us with some milk related stories which had the capacity to make us wonder how true some of them were. We finally left Kevin in peace and headed off to Janice and Johns home where we devoured a very good fish 'n' chip meal collected from Janz Takeaway in Waitara. Following a short formal meeting, Janice provided us with an amazing server. Despite the fact that we really were replete who could resist.


