

Inglewood's New Walkway Taking Shape

Next time the sun comes out, take a wander down to the eastern end of town. Taking shape is a new pathway that connects PG Nops reserve to the lookout over Jubilee Park, along the way meanders along crosscressing the Kurapepe Stream past Joe Gibbs reserve, Trimble Park, through the Inglewood cemetery. It is a very pleasant gentle walk that allows a connection between key public reserves in our town. It is a shared safe off-road walking and cycle path, but is more suitable for walkers with the side trails to the top of Joe Gibbs, Trimble Park and the Jubilee Lookout. It is part of NPDCT's efforts to make walking and cycling easier and safer all over our district. These wonderful reserves, real assets of Inglewood, hopefully will encourage residents to spend more quality time in them with their families. A formal public opening is being planned, but the pathway is open for use now. Robert Trimble was the first chairman of the Inglewood Town Board, a Member of Parliament from 1879 to 1887 and a judge at the Native Land Court. Joe Gibbs was Mayor of Inglewood from 1931 to 1938. The terraces at Jubilee Park, railway lawns and plantings, and the river-stone wall at Trimble Park were some of his projects. PG Nops was a well known Inglewood personality for over 50 years in the first half of the 1900s. And if you want to know, the entire project cost was circa \$193,000, including a bridge over the Kurapepe.

Inglewood Playcentre Celebrate Matariki (Julia Berry)

"Matariki, miramira nga whea..." The sound of Taranaki singing along to the song 'twinkle twinkle little star' in Te reo Māori filled the room at Inglewood Playcentre Thursday morning. This was just one of the ways that the parents and caregivers celebrated Matariki this week so that our Taranaki aged from babies to six could learn about the Māori New Year. On all three mornings we are open, we created invitations to play based around the learning and remembering of Matariki. Some of the favourites were - being able to stamp stars onto black paper and creating playdoh that was in all the colours of the night sky then adding glitter to give the feel of sparkly stars in the sky. Another highlight was when the tamariki got to do their own baking on session. They made star shaped biscuits. New loved baking the biscuits.

Following the Playcentre way, Tamariki are involved in the process. On Thursday morning Izzy was using her language skills to name the colours and started picking which colours should be added to the playdoh next. Addie and Lexi were also using their voice and decision-making skills during the process of making some lox. Lexi would say "it needs more sparkle like the stars" and Addie would agree "ask for some glitter".

Alongside the play, adults used the opportunity to discuss concepts of Matariki and why it is important. Some of this seemed to be taken onboard which was seen later that evening when I arrived home later dinner with my son Dylan (3), he got out of the car and pointed up at the night sky saying "look at the bright stars" ... This created an opportunity to have a game of seeing which star constellation looked like Matariki - or to see if we could see the rising of Puanga star which is more visible in Taranaki - it's one of the brightest stars in the sky which is also known as Rigil in the constellation of Orion. Children learn through play. Parents learn through participation. Inglewood Playcentre invites you to enjoy your first three sessions free, thereafter \$25/term for a family.
