Companion planning and worse in a priyacia way. For example, call-growing, juni-loving plants may share space with lower-growing, Janke tolerant plants. Another plants and whitefly, so planning it alongside or around vegetables such as lettuces, Cabbages, beams and comatoes will protect them. The adults will by the eggs on the nasturium leaves instead. The nasturtium can be pulled while the eyes are at a junior stage to rid the garden of this cycle. Plant marigolds close to crops that suffer from aphids and greenfly. Marigolds emit a scent that repels aphids and attracts hoverflies, which

are a predator of aphids. are a pressure or apress.

Foogloves have a growth-stimulating effect on all the plants near it, it is also said to protect the garden from disease and strengthen tender plants. Certain flowers are grown near edible crops in order to attract insects for pollitation. Capsicums and eggplants, which have smaller flowers, benefit from having flowers nearly to ensure they get pollinated. Bee friendly plants include: calendula, marigolds, surflowers, popples, clover, nasturciums, Queen

Anne's Lace, Echinacea, borage and purple tansy.
Herbs are also very useful, sage is a great herb to plant Herbs are also very useful, sage is a great herb to plant around celety crops, as it helps to keep aplied sawy while Basil improves the flavour of tomatoes when planted alonguide.
