of the best eps.

When you have your comato plant ready for planting, most people think that it shouldn't be dug in too deeply, and covering any lower leaves is wrong. Tomatoes have adventitious roots which means that they have the ability to grow more roots along their stems at any point where it is

the ability to grow more roots along their stems at any point where it is buried. So plant deeply and it will grow a larger, stronger root system along the stem. It then takes up more nutrients and water, keeps the tomato strongly anchored into the soil when the weather gets a bit rough, and even protects it from any late cold snays. Water well, stake on leave until plant gets a little bigger and then put some form of growing structure to keep it tidy, and growing in the right direction.
