This summer we will be doing some research in our project area to see what we can find in the lizard family. We will be putting out tracking tunnels and making safe havens for them using old roofing tiles. Examples of these can be seen in our window display. What is amazing is that they do not just set up house in

the bush. They are also found hiding out in our own backyards, you too could have be some special secretive hilled creatures that are an important part of New Zealands eco system: Skinks and Gecko's! Lizards are mostly found in areas that are safe from predators and fulling in places like leaf litter, rotting logs, old

Lizards are mostly found in areas that are sale from predators and hiding in places like leaf litter, rotting logs, old piles of timber or stacks of bricks, little and pavers. In Tarnaki alone we have I I of the 100 New Zealand species (the get/o and six skink). The worrying statistic is that over 75% of New Zealands native lizards are threatened or at risk!
