

Wonderful World of Lizards (Karen Morratt)

This summer we will be doing some research in our project area to see what we can find in the lizard family. We will be putting out tracking tunnels and making safe havens for them using old roofing tiles. Examples of these can be seen in our window display. What is amazing is that they do not just set up house in the bush. They are also found hiding out in our own backyards, you too could have some special secretive little creatures that are an important part of New Zealand's eco system. Skinks and Geckos! Lizards are mostly found in areas that are safe from predators and hiding in places like leaf litter, rotting logs, old piles of timber or stacks of bricks, tiles and pavers.

In Taranaki alone we have 11 of the 100 New Zealand species (five gecko and six skink). The worrying statistic is that over 75% of New Zealand native lizards are threatened or at risk!

You may have seen that in collaboration with the Taranaki Lizard Group we had planned to celebrate the national "Conservation Week" with a loan of their geckos and skinks. This was going to include a talk by the experts. Our "herpetological event" posters were out, we were promoting this far and wide, then the covid level went up, sadly we had to be postpone, but we will be rescheduling this in the future! We can't wait to host the local society with their lizards and learn more about how we can help to save these native beauties! In the meantime, check out our window display all about lizards and invertebrates and learn the difference between skinks and geckos so you can keep an eye out for them in your garden!

Garden Clues with Sue (Sue March)

Spring is only a month away, and so we should be very busy getting prepared with lots of jobs to be done. It's time to start thinking about preparing and planning for spring planting, including sprouting your seed potatoes to ensure a Christmas harvest. August is also the perfect time for a winter tidy up, clip the hedges, edges and prune a selection of fruit trees.

If you have planted cover crops such as mustard and lupin now is the time to dig them in. These plants will rot down in a matter of weeks, adding nutrients and organic matter to the soil. The seedlings arriving in the last fortnight have been fairly small, and we are assuming the nurseries want to release the stock as soon as ready in case of changing Covid levels. Whatever the case, you can plant sprouts, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, kale, peas, mesclun, onions, silverbeet, spinach, coriander, parsley, rosemary, sage, and thyme. You are probably now harvesting what you planted as we went into Lockdown in March, if you were lucky enough to secure seeds and seedlings before the world went crazy! Lettucos and other salad crops can be planted - in colder areas you may want to use poly tunnels or protective cloches. Potatoes - begin sprouting seed potatoes, as most potato crops take about three months to mature, so need to be in the ground in September for a Christmas harvest. Always choose certified seed potatoes. These are specifically selected to thrive in the home garden and guaranteed to be free of viruses and pests that affect potatoes. Mix Tia Potato Food into garden beds before planting seed potatoes.

And this week's top tip comes from our good customer Merv Saywell, 'mix super phosphate in a bucket of water, and continuously stir while growing your cauliflower and cabbage seedlings in and give them a good dunking. They then absorb straight into the roots, and your crop will be the best you've probably ever had. I'll certainly be giving it a go as I'm not so great at growing these sorts of vegetables. A busy time, just hope the weather stays kind to us, happy gardening this week!
