Garden Clues with Sue (Sue Marsh)

Early autumn is the very best time to get your lawn healthy, weed-free, thickened and looking great in preparation for winter. There are many things for a lawn to look its best, and we probably just plant, mow, fertilise occasionally and hope we will have the best lawn on the street!

Thatch is the dense spongy layer at the base of your lawn made up of eighty interwoven or compacted stems, leaves and roots. Lawns with high levels of thatch (2 cm or more) can create an environment in which disease and insect pests thrive. Poor drainage compacted soil and unfavourable pH can contribute to high levels of thatch. You can apply a D-Thatch product, which naturally encourages the breakdown of excessive thatch by beneficial soil organisms and restores the balance of breakdown to build-up. Alternatively manually remove the excessive thatch by raking out the dead material with a grass rake, de-thatcher rake or mechanical scarifier.

Sweep up leaves or blow them off your lawn, just don't allow autumn leaves to build up on the lawn in autumn and winter as these will weaken the grass underneath and harbour pests and disease. Aerate (spike) your lawn to improve oxygen movement to the grass roots and improve drainage so that the lawn soil is not waterlogged through the winter period. Push a garden fork 10-15 cm into the lawn and gently pull back on the fork to open up the soil structure. Do this over the whole lawn or particularly compacted areas. This also encourages earthworms whose activity in the soil is beneficial because they redistribute nutrients and naturally aerate the soil.

Lawn herbicides are most effective when weeds are growing actively in autumn (and spring). Many weeds will continue to grow through the winter months so dealing with them in autumn will mean many fewer to deal with in spring. Fertilise and sweeten your lawn, which will help it survive the winter to come. Continue to mow, but in later autumn raise your mower height a notch or two and keep your lawn a little longer through the cool months; a good autumn/winter mowing height is approximately 40 mm. Don't forget to overseed any bare patches, and with some of the tips here, you should have a lovely lush green lawn come Spring. Happy Gardening!

Founders Day 100 Year Celebration Lunch

2021 is a significant milestone for the thousands of members belonging to Women's Institutes throughout New Zealand. We are celebrating 100 years since the idea of Women's Institute was introduced to New Zealand by Miss Anna Elizabeth Jerome Spencer. She had just returned from war work in England where Institute groups had steadily expanded since 1915. This popular worldwide organisation originated in Canada on 19 February 1887 after Mrs Adelaide Hoodless addressed a meeting in a small rural centre - Stony Creek, Ontario. Adelaide had been deeply affected by the personal tragedy of losing a young baby. Her influence resulted in Nation-wide support by the Government encouraging women to form groups whose purpose was to broaden knowledge of domestic science and agriculture as well as to socialize. Over the decades, this women's group has undergone many changes including twinning the name in NZ to currently become the NZ Federation of Women's Institutes (Incorporated) in 2004. At present, there are 230 local Women's Institute Groups throughout New Zealand with these overseen by 38 District Federations. Originally, members were from rural communities but in modern times many groups are town based.

Each year Federations throughout NZ celebrate Founders Day in February. Covid-19 level restrictions resulted in our North Taranaki commemorative Luncheon being delayed by several weeks but it did not dim the pleasure guests found in renewing friendships and touching base with friends. Barbara Hunt, a Founding Member of Durham Women's Institute, was present to cut the stunning Centennial Cake. This master piece was baked by Karen Smith and decorated by Gloria Smith.
