

Norfolk School News - Harakeke Weaving with Whaea Wikitoria
(Keara Haliday, Kahurangi McLaren, Savana Leathers, Caitlin Hunger)

A group of senior girls and Whaea Wikitoria meet every Tuesday and Thursday to learn some new things. We have learnt tikanga and kawa (protocols and procedures) of how to weave and respect this cultural tradition. We have learnt how to construct different creations, such as: puti puti (flowers), kōne (four cornered baskets) and kete. A Maori practice is to gift the first piece of work to others, eg. whānau and friends. Sessions begin with an appropriate harakeke karakia (He Karakia ki a Hineteiwaiva), and end with a closing karakia. We have experimented with the correct pronunciation of Maori words such as the names of the different weaves and the connection these have to Hineteiwaiva. As we weave, it reminds us of our connections to our whānau, with each weave bringing us together. Each piece takes on its own life form and grows and unfolds. This is also a time for us to relax, simply share thoughts, and enjoy the moment. Once we have learnt to weave independently we will then pass our knowledge and skills on to others in hope that they will continue this chain of learning.
