

in winter, or shady position in summer. Keep seedlings well watered as they will dry out very quickly in the well watered as they will dry out very quickly in the seed tray. When thing don't go right, and seeds don't germinate you may have planted then too deep, the most likely outcome is that the seed will not have enough energy to push the seedling out and will rot. Maybe your seeds are too old, plant seeds do lose their viability over time, particularly if you're storing them in ordinary, room-temperature conditions. Buy only the seed you need and sow them that year for best results, very tempting to use half used packets out of the cupboard. Under watering or overwatering your seed trays is another common reason why they won't germinate. Temperature is another important factor, some seeds like it warm and others like it cool, so plant and keep them in an appropriate place for the plant and keep them in an appropriate place for the seedlings you are trying to germinate. Most importantly, don't rush them, if you have planted correctly, and followed the rules, then they should come up, we all want to see the first shoots, but sometimes, you just need to have some patience! 
