Milly Marshall-Kirkwood competed in the Solo Power Throwing Academy in Lower Hutt recently and walked away with five NZ records in discus and shot put. This was on the back of two at the Secondary Schools Track and Field Changes held here in Inglewood.

Milly competes as a para athlete and is now part of Athletics NZ's High Performance Throwing team. Brought up on Norfolk Road, the 15 year old Inglewood High student took up discus and shot put while competing at the Halberg Games as a 16 year old and she has attended at every games since.

Milly was born with Marfan Syndrome which is a genetic condition that affects the body's connective tissue. Connective tissue holds all the body's cells, organs and tissue together. It also plays an important role in helping the body grow and develop properly and it can also cause hyper-mobility in joints. Milly is classified as a F57 para-athlete which means that she competes in a seated position and she is only one of two seated athletes in NZ and six in Australia. Milly will be next competing in the NZ Track and Field Championships in Wellington in early March and then thanks to a grant from IPSs Handa and Halberg Foundation, she will travel to Brisbane to compete in the Australian Athletics Championships in late March.

Last year, Milly was awarded the Halberg Foundation Most Promising Athlete Award, so it is clear that she has a promising future in the sport. Although the next Paralympics is in Paris in 2024, it is Milly's goal to represent NZ and win a medal at the 2028 Paralympics in Los Angeles. 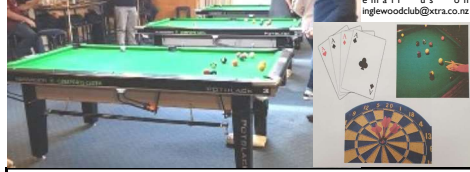

Garden Clues with Sue (Sue Harsh)
Summer has returned in the last few days, with hot sunny days, but after the cyclone, many of you will have sustained damage in your gardens. Heard a few chaimsons over the last few days, but we have been so lucky, and watching the news is heart breaking seeing the damage done to other parts of the country.

Storage of fruit and vegetables due to vast areas of production areas being wiped out, is going to cause issues for the rest of the country. Now is a good time to think about putting in second crops, and I know many of you are already searching for seed potatoes. Demand had already outstripped supply, and although unavailable at present, the suppliers think the next seasons may be ready in April.

We absolutely need to be able to supplement from our own gardens, so as you have spare ground after some of your summer crops have finished, keep replanting with summer crops and get ready for your winter veg as well. We may not have had the longest or hottest summer, but hopefully, we still have plenty growing season months before the coldest months arrive. Perfect planting time, and just remember some cover over those brassicas to keep white butterfly off your plants.

Top up your flower beds, if the rain and wind has done damage, petunias have not been at their best this year due to too much rain. They love extended dry periods, so if you've had enough, pull them out and replace with new colour. Still lots of choice of summer annuals, and even the first of the pansies and violas are starting to appear at garden centres now. Lots to do again this week, so happy gardening.
