Inglewood's Matt Harrison watched the networks of regional internet operators in the Hawke's Bay and Gisborne areas going offline one by one as Cyclone Gabrielle hit. Their power was running down, and their fibre cables had been severed during the storm that smashed into their regions, the head of New Plymouth's regional provider Primo knew he had to lend a hand. He borrowed his wife Jasmine's horse boat and loaded it up with spare solar panels, batteries, fuel, generators, network gear, food and water, coolers and gas, plus some other hastily gathered supplies donated by local and Primo's customers.

Harrison is a founder and deputy chair of the Wireless Internet Service Providers Association of New Zealand and has strong contacts with many of the regional businesses that look after the rural telecommunications sector. He knew what they needed – solar panels and batteries for converting main sites, generators to run the bigger sites that can't be turned into solar, fuel for those generators, and more generators to keep batteries charged for swapping them out at residential sites that can't have generators running all night.

He also grabbed one of his team, Sam Adlam – an all-rounder in all things construction, electronic and wireless. Plus he's a Scout leader so he has useful skills in these sorts of situations. It also meant another vehicle to tow generators and more room to pick up donated dog food to give to those in need. They hit the road for Napier where the first stop was GeoNet Broadband, a wireless internet company that mainly looks after rural customers and isolated communities in the Hawke's Bay. They're just like Primo, with a habit of making things work when things don't want to in some remote parts of the country.

During the Saturday morning they helped GeoNet's Ray Taylor get fibre uplink sites back online by installing new batteries and dropping off a satellite. They also dropped off essential cooling generator and fuel supplies to some of Primo's customers' families in the area. Continued Page 3

**PRIMO** Next, Jesse Archer from another regional provider - Full Flavour - who happens to have a pilot's license, flew his Cessna down from Tauranga and picked up what was needed to get Wairoa back online. He and a Geico technician headed to the town and by Saturday afternoon Wairoa was back online with connectivity restored to the public CBD Wi-Fi hotspots. Once Wi-Fi was online the Wairoa District Council asked for help to get remote connections online to run the water pumps and treatment plant which were out of action. No helicopters were available so Matt and Sam hit the road, but what was usually a 90-minute drive became a 14-hour detour via Palmerston North and Whakaitane to get around the badly ravaged roads.

They also had with them a week's worth of food and water for 30 people and delivered that to the Wairoa Rock Church, along with even more food and water, plus lots of bedding and clothes donated by Whakaitane people. This important cargo included some sweets and chocolates for the kids, and fresh bananas which are like gold right now!

The pair also met up with AnNet Broadband installer Anaru Cooper, who has enough fuel to top up his ute. He's fitted it with a satellite uplink and a Wi-Fi access point and was driving around Wairoa providing broadband access for free to those in need, and being a local, Anaru also knew the people who needed the donated dog food at the board the most. The weekend finished with a drive home on Sunday. In total they'd notched up 2022 kilometres in three days, they were pleased to help. Matt says the scenes of devastation there were just heart-breaking.

On 26 February the new wicket at Koro Park was officially opened by club President/Life member Graham Harris. The cost to the Inglewood Cricket Club, helped by a grant from TET was \$47,000.00. A big thank you to Mike Davey TET chair for help with putting our case to the trust.

The actual wicket is of Paramahoe Clay and had to be trucked in. It is the same as Pukekura Park wicket and is the first time Inglewood has had a proper clay wicket since moving from Carrville Park in 1989. Due to the inclement weather since December, this was the fourth attempt to officially declare the wicket open.

Congratulations to Inglewood High School's Monique Wyszewski, who at just 15 years old, has been named on the Swimming New Zealand Long List for the 2023 Youth Commonwealth Games which will take place in Trinidad and Tobago from 4 - 11 August. She was one of just 40 swimmers to be selected and will compete in the 100m Breaststroke. Monique swins for Aquababe New Plymouth Swimming Club and over the past year alone has had some outstanding achievements; the most recent being her record breaking 50m Breaststroke race at the HS swimming pools, in which she set a new record of 35.72s, breaking the previous record by 3.94 seconds. In January Monique competed in the Wellington Long Course Champs and placed first in the 50m Breaststroke in the time of 31.49s setting the new New Zealand Age record for 15 y olds. And in December of 2022, Monique took part in the Queensland Championships in a few events. Firstly the 100m Breaststroke 15 y old girls placing first with a time of 1:10:81 equalling the NZ age record. Secondly she competed in the 50m Breaststroke 15 y old girls and placed first with a time of 31:69 breaking the NZ age record. She also swam the fastest 50m Breaststroke time out of all the women and achieved the All times Queensland record for 15y old girls 50m Breaststroke. Monique's sights are set high for the next few years. She aspires to "qualify for the 2024 Olympics" and given that she is merely "four seconds off the qualifying time for 100m breaststroke", it is well within her sights. She also shares her appreciation for her mum and dad, family friends and coaches for their support. To have such an accomplished athlete attending our local community high school is surreal. We will be keenly watching and supporting Monique with her future goals and are eagerly waiting to see her swim on the world stage.

**Garden Clues with Sue**  
(See March)

Autumn is here and March is a major harvesting period so the garden will be full of delicious crops to enjoy. The garden will be laden with crops like tomatoes, beans, sweetcorn and beetroot, all ready to be picked, bottled, preserved, and prepared for use over the colder months, or just keep eating and giving away your surplus.

As it's a major harvesting period for both fruit and veges it's the perfect time to plant more for continuous harvests over the cooler months. Many summer crops will be harvested and pulled out of the ground now, while any garden areas that are empty take time to replenish the soil with a new layer of compost or Tui Sheep Pellets. There are plenty of choices to plant, beetroot, bok choy, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, cauliflower, celery, coriander, kale, leek, lettuce, mesclun, onions, parsley, radish, rhubarb, rocket, silverbeet, spinach, spring onions.

With autumn's arrival the first of the bulbs are now in store, so it's time to pick your bulbs to plant for a stunning spring show. As soon as the soil cools down, plant new bulbs or fertilise existing ones with Tui Bulb Food.
