ETEC Kiwi Monitoring (Karen Mount)

The kiwi in our monitoring programme are checked monthly with telemetry tracking equipment with the information being recorded that gives insights into their behaviour. The transmitters (dst) attached to the leg of the kiwi (which have a radio signal) the telemetry equipment picks up) can tell us whether the bird is incubating or not, what time it started moving the previous evening and how long it foraged for overnight. If any kiwi are recorded in mortality, the goal is to go in asap to find the birds. Most often it is a dropped egg where it has fallen off the kiwi's leg. The egg has a battery life of around 12 months, so the kiwi need to be caught annually for the tag change before the battery runs out. At this time they are given a health check - body condition assessment, they are weighed, their bill length is measured, and the new tag is put on the opposite leg so as to reduce rubbing on one leg.

Garden Clues with Sue (Sue Marsh)

Autumn is a great planning season, and with obvious reasons, quite a difference in what we plant compared to the assortment grown in spring. Summer crops are being harvested and although gardens may still be full, we should make space for winter vegetables now. Everything including weeds continue to grow, with the rain we can expect to experience on a regular basis these late summer months. If we look back when the country went into lockdown the very first time, everyone secured seedlings and seeds, shelves were stripped at garden centres, and many of us had amazing winter and spring gardens, as we realised the benefits of having our own supply in our backyards. Less continue the trend, the pandemic lockdowns have gone, but economy issues, and damage from Cyclone Gabrielle will have an effect on many in our local communities. Did you know, or had you forgotten, Inglewood has a Community Food Bank right here in Inglewood, which in previous years has been a group of wonderful people maintain, plant, harvest, and distribute through the Food bank.
