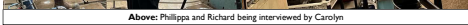


Seven Sharp Visits Fun Ho! Toys

Last Thursday evening Fun Ho! Toys and the Fun Ho! Toy Museum featured on Seven Sharp. Carolyn Robinson, journalist for Seven Sharp, had visited the week before, filming, interviewing and photographing. The clip depicted the Fun Ho! Toy story giving the background on the start with Jack Underwood in the 1930's and then moving to the present with current toy makers Richard Jordan and Philippa Peters. Fun Ho! Toys was, during its peak time, New Zealand's biggest toy maker, employing over 200 people at the factory, which was originally on Marama Street in Inglewood. When the factory shut down in the eighties due to imports taking over and making it uneconomical the Fun Ho! Toy Museum was brought into being by the Inglewood Development Trust. The Museum is run by the Inglewood Development Trust with Fun Ho! Toys (privately owned) operating out of the museum. Carolyn enjoyed her visit exploring the process of toy making from start to finish and even having the opportunity to sand cast her own toy. Our evening excursion was filled with appreciation, awe and nostalgia as we visited two local attractions. Richard Jordan was our charming host and fount of information at our first venue. We really should have allowed more time as there was so much more to investigate and many more questions that could have been asked. Despite having visited previously with grandchildren I really had little idea of the history and depth of information contained behind the doors of The Inglewood Information Centre and Fun Ho! National Toy Museum. Currently there is also an impressive Heritage Centre display documenting the long history of the Inglewood Band Rounds and Brass Band. The extensive collection of iconic Fun Ho toys, original moulding plates, interactive displays and functioning toy factory are absolutely fascinating. The story of the development and obvious success of the venture testament to excellent vision and hard work. It builds on the legacy of Jack Underwood and a sideline that then expanded to 50 years of manufacturing a popular range of sturdy aluminum toys until cheaper toy imports found their way to New Zealand shores. We also had a peek at the enormous printer that produces the wonderful editions of the Moa Mail. Over 2700 copies now churned out in 24 hours. Sandra Rowan warmly welcomed us into her purpose built Sandra's Jigsaw Studio at our next destination. Sandra has been doing puzzles since she was three years old and in her current display were examples from the 1950s right up to present day acquisitions. We were all blown away by the stunning feature wall comprised of 18,000 pieces that took her 300 hours to assemble! I think everyone was surprised by the variety of puzzle types - not just your regular 2-D creations. Funk Fish punctually provided our tasty take-away dinner which we enjoyed at Karen and Nigel Smiths home in front of a cosy fire. After the formal part of our meeting the much anticipated supper and cuppa concluded a very interesting evening. Inglewood has many excellent reasons and activities to attract locals and visitors. We should be proud.

Gardening Clues With Sue (Sue Marsh)

HAMMER HELP WITH THE WEATHER
Typically, August always feels like it's the wettest month, but it does feel like we haven't had too much fine weather over the last six months. We now look forward to longer days on the horizon, but it does mean, we can get our gardens ready for the coming growing season. So once the weather allows, prepare your soil, remove all the weeds and dig the soil over. Break up any lumps and bumps with your spade. Add compost and sheep pellets and dig through the top layer of soil. If you are using your homemade compost dig that in now, it will need a few weeks to settle before you plant. Plant seedlings of Broccoli, cauliflower, leeks, silverbeet, onion, spinach, cabbage, and lettuce. Sow peas, plant the seeds directly into the ground, they prefer the cooler early spring weather. Protect from any late frosts. Sow seeds of Cabbage, kale, cauliflower, lettuce, celery, onion, broccoli, silverbeet, carrots and spinach. Protect from the cold, transplant to the garden as the weather warms and when they are showing at least two sets of true leaves. Remember to protect all seedlings from slugs and snails, they love tender seedlings and the wet weather! Herbs can go in the ground or in pots, most herbs are companion plants to vegetables so keep them close to maximise their benefits. Plant new Strawberries, add strawberry food to the soil as you plant and at the same time give your older plants a side dressing. Pinch out the very first flowers to let the plant become more established, you will get a better harvest. Rhubarb can be planted, add blood and bone to the soil as you plant. Use the blood and bone around existing plants as well, water in the fertiliser. Feed your passionfruit vines with citrus fertiliser, they are heavy feeders so be generous. New season Fajolca can be planted, add blood and bone to the soil as you plant, and feed your existing trees with a long-term fertiliser. Yes, sounds exhausting, but let's get gardening!

EAST TARANAKI ENVIRONMENT COLLECTIVE

ETEC's Youth Kaitiakitanga Ambassadors (kai Strang)

Here's something you probably haven't heard of. Youngsters from nine Taranaki primary schools have in common they are Youth Kaitiakitanga ambassadors for the East Taranaki Environment Collective. The Year 6, 7 and 8 children from Inglewood, St Patrick's Inglewood, Waitara Central St Joseph's Waitara, Kaimata, Waitoriki, Egmont Village, Northcote and Huirangi have been attending workshops with ETEC staff to learn all about the organisation's quest to save our region's native biodiversity. There, they are learning that ETEC is kaitiaki of 18,000ha of East Taranaki land, and that pest control work is critical to the survival of many native species including kiwi, kōkako, and long-tailed bat. A total of four workshops are being held. The first has been at Everett Park and has focussed on pest control, with the pupils shown what pest animals exist in New Zealand, how traps work, how they are baited, and how trap lines are positioned so they can be regularly checked. ETEC's headquarters in Inglewood has been the venue for the second workshop, which has been all about pest monitoring how methods and equipment such as chew cards, tracking tunnels, trail cameras, and wax tags are all used to help ensure pest numbers are being reduced and kept low enough to aid the survival of native species. Further workshops will educate the pupils on New Zealand's native bird species, and how ETEC staff conduct special surveys to keep an eye on population numbers. ETEC general manager Rebecca Somerfield says the Youth Kaitiakitanga programme is essential to future success of the organisation. "Care of our biodiversity is vital to the future of the natural environment in Taranaki and the rest of our country," she says. "With that as background, it is essential that our tamariki are made aware not only of the importance of biodiversity, but also of methods for improving it."

History of Band Rotunda and Inglewood Bands

Pedestrians passing the Fun Hol Toy Museum over recent days may have been surprised to see the Band Rotunda inside the Heritage Centre such is the excellent replica of the Band Rotunda. Archivist Gay Laurence and husband Kevin who built the Band Rotunda have researched the history of the Band Rotunda and the various bands in Inglewood. Did you know that the Inglewood Pipe Band in 1906, to raise publicity and funds, climbed to the summit of Mt Taranaki in their kites! There is a photographic proof of this event in the Heritage Centre. The Band Rotunda was to be built for the coronation of King Edward VII on 9 August 1902 but this did not happen and then for the coronation of King George V on 22 June 1911 but was not completed until 1912. Come along and have a look at another display of local history. A booklet about the Inglewood Band Rotunda and Inglewood (Municipal) Brass Band can be purchased. Remember if you are having a clean out the Heritage Centre are always keen to receive items of interest relating to Inglewood history. Photos can be copied and returned to owners - quite often it is the background in a photo that is of great interest to Gay.
