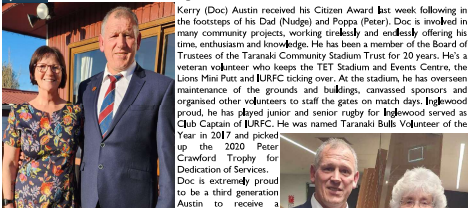


**Local Legends Receive Citizens Awards**

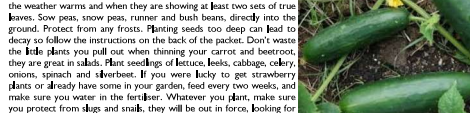

**Gardening Clues With Sue (Sue March)**

After a lovely spell of fine days in late August, we have finally made it to Spring, and a very busy time hopefully in the garden. If you haven't already prepared the soil now is the time to get started. If it doesn't meet turning over, then spread a couple of bags of compost over the bare soil and dig through the top layer before you plant. Empty your compost bin, it is ready when it is the consistency of lumpy soil don't plant straight into it though, it is too rich. Leave for a few weeks before planting. Sow seeds of carrots, parsnip, broccolini, silverbeet, peas, lettuce, beets, cabbage, tomato, capsicum, courgette, melon, cucumber and eggplant. Transplant to the garden as the weather warms and when they are showing at least two sets of true leaves. Sow peas, snow peas, runner and bush beans, directly into the ground. Protect from any plants. Plant seedlings of lettuce, celery, onions, spinach and asparagus. If you were lucky to get strawberry plants or already have some in your garden, feed every two weeks, and make sure you water in the fertiliser. Whatever you plant, make sure you protect from slugs and snails, they will be out in force, looking for some tasty new shoots to munch on.

Choose your seed potatoes now, and get your garden bed ready for planting out, there is a large range, and plan to have early varieties planted out so you can have delicious new potatoes for Christmas. In the lower garden, continue replacing your winter flowers with new spring annuals as needed. A pinch of blood & bone as you plant your annuals will give them a head start. Continue to replant your pots, if the potting soil is old it will be depleted, remove the old soil, add new container mix and fresh new flowers. Have fun with colour, enjoy the choice that will be on show in Spring in the garden centres, there are new varieties every season, so watch out for them. Happy gardening this week!

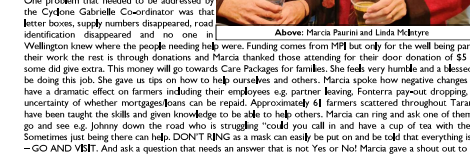

### Inglewood First IAS (Vida Harman)

Marie Pearce opened the August IAS with a warm welcome to everyone and especially our guest Marcia Purton from the Tararaki Rural Support Trust and thanked the TETU Theatre for the use of their facilities.

Marcia has been in the Rural Support Trust since April 2015. She had a 21 year career at the RD which Marcia said taught her a lot about tolerance and gave her real good communication skills, including empathy and listening. So along with working at a bank and an accounting firm it has given her some real good skills to do this job. It was a baptism by fire when having started the job in April 2015 the June 2015 floods hit affecting Tararaki, Wanganui, Rangitikei and the Manawatu. There are 14 Rural Support Trusts throughout NZ. They all keep in touch with each other by a Co-ordinators conference call each month. One problem that needed to be addressed by the Cordene Gabrielle Coordinator was that letter boxes, supply numbers disappeared, road identification disappeared and no one in Wairangi knew where the people needing help were. Funding comes from MPI but only for the well being part of \$5 and some did give extra. This money will go towards Care Packages for families. She feels very humble and a blessed to be doing this job. She gave us tips on how to help ourselves and others. Marcia spoke how negative changes can have a dramatic effect on farmers, including their employees e.g. partner leaving. Farmers' uncertainty of whether mortgages/loans can be repaid. Approximately 61 farmers scattered throughout Tararaki have been taught the skills and given knowledge to be able to help others. Marcia can ring and ask one of them to go and see if Johnny down the road who is struggling "could you call in and have a cup of tea with them". Sometimes just being there can help. DON'T RING as a mask can easily be put on and be told that everything is ok - GO AND VISIT. And ask a question that needs an answer that is not Yes or No! Marcia gave a shout out to our committee member Katrina Kowalski who is one of the Rural Trust's Facilitators and is the "Queen" and so very supportive to Marcia in her role and supports other co-ordinators in the North Island in their roles. She is the "crossjars" between MPI and Rural Support. It is wonderful to have Katrina on her team. Anyone needing help can contact Rural Support on 0800 787 254.
