Gardening Clues With Sue (Sue Marks)
 November is a busy month in the garden, when we get planting all of our summer favourites. Whether you are more of a flower person, than a veggie planter, then you have choices galore. In the flower garden, everything is still looking spruce like, the roses should be full of bud, and perennials are growing well. There are lots of new perennials, penutias and calliabras again this year, every year, more colours, more choice, so experiment with colour. If you want your containers to look amazing when your visitors arrive next month then freshen up your pots with summer colour. Use annuals or combined them with perennial penutias, to make a statement. Love hanging baskets, then see our selection of ready to go planted baskets, you don't have to make them, let us do them for you. In the veggie gardens you will hopefully have some room for tomatoes, cucumbers, courgettes and even a pumpkin, squash or butternut. The key is placement, and most of these need consistent water, sunny weather to get the best from your crops. Don't forget if space is a premium, then plant some veges in containers, tumbling tons are one such beauty. Sweet little cherry tomatoes, that you can pot up, and let them grow in a sunny shinkered spot. Just don't forget to water consistently, as containers will dry out way before your garden beds do. Keep those lawns mowed, cut your edges, spray if you have weeds, and bring back that pristine green patch that should be lovely to look at, and wonderful to play on. Think of what you need to make your life easier in the garden, and start to drop hints, so you get lucky and actually get something useful for Christmas this year! I may have booked twice at my 'baby chair' given to me as a gift last year, but oh how I love my little gardening buddy, and even better I don't have to wait for someone else to make a date to cut stuff off or down. At least I know when to stop cutting, which doesn't seem to be an issue with the blades who own chainsaws, you know who you are, so happy gardening the week, chain saw or not!

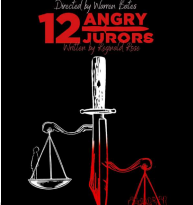
