Remember The Mountain Goat Farm Bike

The Mountain Goat was invented in New Plymouth by Motorcycle Dealer Johnny Callender in the early 1960's. These were the first purpose built Farm Bikes manufactured in NZ, with over 100 made in New Plymouth by Callender Manufacturing Co. Production was then stepped up at the Waitara Assembly Plant 'Mountain Camp' where various models were produced with many being sold overseas. Over 2000 bikes were produced in the late 1960s and early 1970's. Local Laurie Callender (Johnny's son) has sourced a company in New Zealand to have an abstract of these bikes made into a puzzle. A great gift for a motorbike enthusiast and these puzzles can now be purchased at the Fun Ho! National Toy Museum.

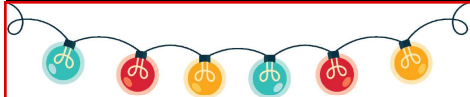

Tree Comes Down

Thursday 30 November any late bird risers would have been woken up to the sound of chainsaws disturbing their sleep. One of the big trees on the other side of the Band Rounda was being cut down. The tree has graced our view for many a year but unfortunately it was becoming dangerous, beginning to split and no one in our community would have wanted to see it come down on a passing train or a member of the public.

The sound of the chainsaw filled the air around the town until quite late in the evening. Many stopped and looked and wondered at the amazing skill of the man up the tree dangling precariously by a safety harness and holding on to the chainsaw.

Restore PG Nops Reserve (Leigh Monroy)

Spring is synonymous with birds nesting and raising chicks but, inconspicuously, where we live, work and play, native plants are also creating new life. Seedlings are sprouting from the soil and reaching for the sun. In this photo is a Makomako (wineberry) seedling. Makomako is a small, fast growing native tree which takes its name from the makō shark due to the serrated margins of its leaves. It has dark red to purple-black berries which are attractive to native birds. In PG Nops Reserve native seedlings have to compete against a multitude of weeds. These threaten to displace, smother and strangle them. In the background you can see a wool fodge. At the November working bee five of us filled eight fodes of weeds which will be collected by NPOC. We also spread a load of bark to suppress future weeds at the entrance to the reserve. One of the joys of volunteering to care for the reserve is observing the new native seedlings grow in spring. Our next working bee is 13:00pm Sunday the 28th January 2024. We meet at the Tawa Street entrance. We would love to see some new faces. 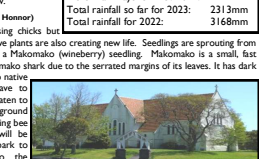
