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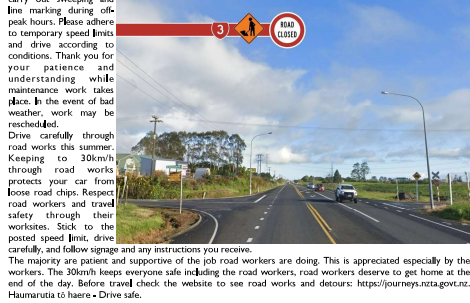
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Resurfacing SH3 Inglewood to Stratford

WAKA KOTAHU Planning ahead for two weeks of overnight northbound closures between Dudley Road, Inglewood and Mouton Road, Stratford, starting from Sunday 14 January 7.00am-4.00pm Sunday 14 January 7.00am-4.00pm

Southbound remains open with a temporary speed restriction. Northbound road users please consider using SH45 as an alternate route, this adds 20 minutes to your journey. Crews will carry out sweeping and line marking during off-peak hours. Please adhere to temporary speed limits and drive according to conditions. Thank you for your patience and understanding while maintenance work takes place. In the event of bad weather, work may be rescheduled. Drive carefully through road works this summer. Keeping to 30km/h through road works protects your car from loose road chips. Respect road workers and travel safely through their work sites. Enrolment at Inglewood GSA is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on the school website or from the school office.

The board is now inviting applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Inglewood Primary School starting within Term One 2024.

All applications must be received by 3.00pm Monday 22 January for Term One 2024. If a ballot for one of our places is required, it will be held on Wednesday 24 January 2024. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

The board has determined that 20 places from Year 1-8 are likely to be available for out-of-zone students within Term One 2024. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the year should notify the school to assist the school to plan appropriately.

The application form for enrolment is available from the school website, or from the school office.

Please note that the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available; students will be selected by ballot. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Details relating to the next enrolment period Term Two 2024 will be published March 2024.
