NEW TWOOTH Going for a stroll in Inglewood will be even easier once the Windsor Walkway is sealed by STATE CONTROL NOTE. Work on the \$1.3m project kicks off this week which will see 3.7km of the walkway concreted that is currently loose metal or grass berm. "When it's finished it lie an all-weather walkway separated from the road, that'll be much safer and easier for everyone to use," says NPDC Local Councillor Marie Pearce.

"This new sealed walkway will allow more people to explore a beautiful part of our district whether you're walking the dog, out with a stroller or on a mobility scooter." The Windsor Walkway is a 4.5km loop in the south-easter part of the town. This upgrade is expected to be finishe later this year, weather permitting, and will include element of cultural expression through a partnership with Pukerangiora Hapū. 


