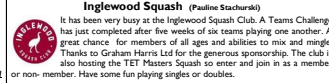

St Andrew's Peace Memorial Church Renovation Activity (Graeme Styles)

The planned renovation of St Andrew's Peace Memorial Church Ingwood has started. The church was closed in January 2019 when the National Building Standards were introduced and it was assessed as an earthquake risk. For the past five years the church has stood, floodlit every night by TET, but unused as a church. This historic building is the most significant building in Ingwood and it has over 100 years of history. It was designed and built after the First World War (1914 - 1918). The community of the day raised the funds to build this church and it was dedicated to all those men of the district who lost their lives in that war. This is a public call to support the renovation of this historic building. Apart from money we need storage space to shift pews, pulpits and other church regalia from the building to allow the restoration to proceed. The photo indicates many other objects and we have 27 pews gifted by families. All made from this region. Ardern Peeters Architects of New Plymouth have been appointed as architect and project manager and he organised a number of subcontractors to provide specific information to enable final plans to be produced. During this past fortnight you may have noticed machine drilling on the site. That was completed to ensure the ground is stable. Right now we have a lot of pews and other church items that need to be stored while the church is strengthened and renovated. Do you have space to hold some of these items?
