



We are seeking ideas and expressions of interest from the Community.



### Restore PG Nops Reserve


Weeds are not the only pests threatening the native flora and fauna of PG Nops Reserve. A range of animal predators make the reserve their home. Traps are set to control ferrets, stoat and rats as part of Towards Predator Free Taranaki, and in February NPDC laid the protein-based bait Vespex for wasps. There are four species of introduced wasps in New Zealand: German, Common, Australian paper and Asian paper. They will roam up to 1km from their nest in the hunt for nectar and insects. They even kill young chicks in the nest. Unfortunately mild winters, a plentiful food source and a lack of natural predators make it easy for them to thrive. We always watch out for wasps while we are working.

In March our four volunteers filled two wood fences for ticks by NPDC. We continue to remove pest plants from the banks of the Kuraepa stream and cover the ground with bark to suppress regrowth. In May and June we will be undertaking planting to fill the weed shaped holes. Unfortunately we have discovered another weed invader, Yellow bristle grass, has recently made its way into the reserve.
