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Gardening Clues with Sue (Sue Marsh)


As the chill of winter starts to creep in, late May is the perfect time to prepare your garden for the colder months ahead. Enrolment at Ingwood School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on the school website or from the school office.

The board is now inviting applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Ingwood Primary School starting within Term 3 2024.

All applications must be received by 3pm Monday 24 June for Term 3 2024. If a ballot for out-of zone places is required, it will be held on Wednesday 26 June 2024. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

The board has determined that 10 places from Year 1-5 are likely to be available for out-of-zone students within Term 3 2024. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during the year should notify the school to assist the school to plan appropriately.

The application form for enrolment is available from the school website, or from the school office.

Please note, that if the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Details relating to the next enrolment period Term 4 2024 will be published September 2024.

On Saturday 25th May the Ingwood Volunteer Fire Brigade held their AGM and Honours night. Each year, brigade members are recognised for the service they have done to Fire and Emergency NZ (FENZ). These awards are given out by the United Fire Brigades' Association (UFA).

This year's recipients of these awards went to: Three year certificates to FF Kate Stuart and QFF Dusty Montgomery. Five year medals to FF Janet Peters and FF Helen Rose. After you've received your five year medal you receive a silver bar for every two years service. These went to: QFF Jini Baker (seven years), OS Craig Pyler (nine years), QFF Alex O'Donnell (nine years), SFF Harrison West (11 years), SO Peter van Koppen (17 years), SO Peter Susans (19 years), SFF Grant Maechler (21 years). After you've received your 25 year Gold Star you receive a gold bar for every two years service. These went to: OS Terry Griffiths (31 years), OS Colin Kilpatrick (52 years).

Life Member Jackets were presented to: SO David Jull and QFF John Wheatley. Long Service Good Conduct Medal and Clasp - This award is given to operational members of recognised service to FENZ. Medals are awarded at 14 years service and then a clasp every seven years after that.

The recipients of these awards were given to: DFCO Lance Atterley (28 years), CFC Cameron Gillespie (35 years).

On Saturday 18th May, four from the Ingwood Brigade competed in the Firefighter Sky Tower Challenge. This was all to raise funds for Leukaemia and Blood Cancer New Zealand. Each year up to 12 residents are awarded from nominations received by the New Plymouth community.

New Concrete For Vertical Horizons (LeAnne Blakelock)

With the aid of a grant to partially fund the concrete upgrade from Toi Foundation, Vertical Horizon has now resurfaced the top car-park leading into Weka and the newly refurbished Kauri Lodge. Camp Director Paul Hitchcock is pleased with the progress being made to camp and thanks local contractor Coastal Concrete for working in with the gaps in camp bookings to get the project completed.

"Access to Weka and Kauri Lodge is now so much easier for those that may have mobility issues, and there will no longer be puddles of water on rainy days to avoid when commuting between buildings" he said.

Over the past seven years the camp has embarked on nearly a million dollars worth of upgrades including the acquisition, relocation and refurbishment of Tawhi Hall into a second dining hall. The acquisition and refurbishment of Weka Lodge (the school hall from St Joseph's Strarford) into parent accommodation, additional showers and service rooms. Reroofing and reining the interior of Waitui Hall upgrading heating to heat pumps. Re-roofing the gym and original dining room. A refurbishment of Kauri Lodge into additional parent and teacher accommodation. Upgrade to the water system to move the kitchen to rain water and UV filtration. Retrofitted low flush toilets to all cabins. All of this while contending with the trials and tribulations of covid. The camp has a vision of enabling all schools to be able to experience the outdoors and by making the facility flexible to accommodate multiple schools and groups at once, the camp can run more efficiently and cost effectively for all. Prior to covid the camp hosted on average 6,000 school age students for camps every year. Demand is now soaring and looks to be back to prior levels with bookings now stretching out until 2027.

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Previous kitchen experience would be good, but not essential as training will be provided. Annually, in late autumn and winter, we enjoy filling the weed shaped holes with native plants. Thanks to the hard work of our volunteers at the May working bee 90 new plants call PG Nops Reserve their home. The species include: Corsi acacia, Toetoe, Ti kouka (Cabbage tree), Haraake (Flax) and Houhere. After planting we spread bark on the ground to help suppress the weeds which grow rapidly. The native plants will need releasing for a couple years until they are tall and robust enough to hold their own. We appreciated the two extra pair of hands provided by Sharon and Zana.
