Collection pick-up days will be same day as the residential collection (Wednesday) ready for pick up in the Inglewood CBD at 6.00am. There will be annual charge of \$305, invoiced quarterly. As with the residential collection, there will be one bin for each of mixed recyclables, glass and rubbish.


