Annabel Stevenson from Inglewood has won the World Waka Association (WWA) 10 - 13 year old girls Nautique WWA World Championship 2024 held at the Marine Stadium on the Gold Coast from Australia from 26 September to 29 September.

The event proved to be a real rising roller coaster and baptism of fire for a young competitor as her first world champ event.

The weather proved extremely challenging for Annabel's qualifying heat which resulted in two falls during her first pass. Fortunately Annabel had put in enough tricks with technically and intensity to qualify her for the final.

The next day for the final, Annabel overcame her riding strategy to account for the difficult riding conditions and managed to put together a two pass run that demonstrated her best riding ability for the conditions.

The WWA World Championship title reflects lots of time spent training and braving the cold winter waters of Lake Taupo, Lake Rotomanga, Lake Rotorangi and Lake Taupo. Annabel's next challenge is in October where she travels to Hangzhou in China to compete in the International Waterski and Wakeboard Federation (IWBF) 2024 World Championships in the under 14 girls category.

Vet News (Kaz Buchanan)

Any loud noise can cause a pet's anxiety to skyrocket, especially fireworks.

How Can I help my Dog? Tire them out through the day (run, walk, play) so they will sleep or relax at night when fireworks are expected. Ensure all windows and doors are shut, close curtains and turn on the television or play music to muffle the sound of the fireworks. Consider distracting your dog from the fireworks by giving them a chew toy or playing a game with them. Giving them a bone or Kong. If in a crate put a blanket over it so they cannot see out. Try not leave your pets alone while fireworks are going off. Never punish for display of unwanted behavior.

Ear muffs to muffle sound. Calming caps cover dogs eyes to reduce visual stimulation. Safe retreat, crate or a closet to give security and confidence. How Can I help my Cat? A safe, warm, and easily accessible place to sleep and hide indoors. An elevated hiding place will help them feel more comfortable. Ensure doors and windows are closed, also cat flaps are locked so they cannot escape. Provide plenty of litter trays, especially if your cat is used to toileting outdoors. One per cat plus one extra. Playing music or having the television on can also help muffle loud bangs. Having fun toys such as treat balls can help distract them.

Phonemone Support - Felvony is a synthetic copy of the facial pheromone which tells your cat that an area is safe and familiar. You can use a plug-in diffuser or spray.

Feed your cat early in the evening when still light outside. Separate feeding stations. Water bowls and litter trays. There are a number of products that we have available to help your pets get through. Give us a call or come in and see us.

Nine years ago, she began the Taranaki Shoe Box Christmas appeal with the help of her sister-in-law after seeing a need in a New Plymouth kindergarten. The first year they gave boxes to 1200 children after a phenomenal response from kind hearted people. It is a way that the community can show it cares about cancer and families. Positive experiences such as experiencing the joy of Christmas can mean a lot to a child whose family is struggling with hardship. The project and need have continued to grow with the website kohatree.co.nz helping with the logistics. Ideally the boxes will be of a uniform size and contain something to read, something to treasure, a personal care item and something to eat. The recommended value of the contents can be from \$20 up to \$50. In some cases, students at a whole school or pre-school might receive boxes or it could be one or two families. It is a partnership between education providers and community organisations. You can sign up as an individual or group. The website gives more information if you are interested in finding out more about how you might help. Following our business meeting, members began assembling items in emergency bags for hospital patients admitted at short notice and next month we are visiting the Hearing Dogs.
