They have spent thousands of hours at the reserve at working bees and organise educational visits to spread the word about its importance with community groups. East Tararaki Environment Collective and Pukerangora Hapū won the Environmental Action in the Community for working collaboratively to protect and enhance the environment at Everett Park Scenic Reserve and increasing understanding of environmental issues. The East Tararaki Environment Collective in partnership with Pukerangora Hapū, are working together to improve the biodiversity within the Everett Park Scenic Reserve. Collaborating with the Department of Conservation since 2022, a major pest eradication programme has included installing 300 traps with monitoring showing a dramatic reduction in possum and rat numbers. The judges commended the initiative for its impact on increasing native birdlife and creating a programme that benefits both the environment and the community.

The star of the visit was the adorable, very attentive, sweet and intelligent, Cavalier King Charles spaniel, ten year old Ruby. Encouraged and rewarded by trainer Chris and presenters Clare McLaughlin and Morris West, Ruby happily demonstrated how Hearing Dogs respond to everyday sounds such as the doorbell, timer, text message alerts and so forth. Ruby did love her treats and praise. The presentation to our group took place in a simulated home environment, complete with bedrooms, kitchen and television.  
Currently there are four specially selected pups in training at the New Plymouth complex. These arrive at about eight months old after being nurtured by volunteers, trainers and socialisers in their homes from eight weeks of age. The training lasts six months. The placement person participates in a week of intensive training. Currently there is an 18 month waiting list. The deaf and hard of hearing recipients live throughout NZ, and the dogs are exposed to particular activities during the programme to be a good match so both parties will be happy and confident. There are 62 working dogs and 11 confidence and companionship dogs. One of the fundraising activities the centre offers is Doggy Day care on a Wednesday which sounded like it would be a lot of fun.

**Change to Emergency Services for Small Animal Patients (Greg Hay)**  
On 9<sup>th</sup> December a new independent after-hours emergency service is opening in New Plymouth and will provide emergency medical and surgical services for small animal patients in the Tararaki region. We believe this is much needed service for clients, pets and veterinarians.  
The advantages for our clients are a veterinarian and nurse are on-site all night. Any surgical cases are dealt with promptly rather than having to wait for other team members to get to the clinic. Experienced veterinarians will attend to your needs. Cases will be referred back to your normal veterinarian the next day for on-going care. Good communication during the night if your animal is deteriorating. A walk-in drop-off and assessment can be done after-hours and such animals directed to the appropriate veterinary service the next day.  
We will be supporting this service and as of 13<sup>th</sup> December we will be directing all small animal emergency calls to this service after 7:00pm at night and in weekends/public holidays (outside our normal Saturday hours). What this means for you: From the 13<sup>th</sup> December if you need after hours emergency treatment for your sick or injured pet after 7:00pm you ring the normal clinic number and you will be directed to the A + V service. After 7:00pm our local small animal vet won't be on duty. The service is based on Lynton Street off Carrington Road in Upper Vogeltown, New Plymouth.

**Inglewood District Health Trust (Aisling George)**

In October our Nurse Manager Penny Hook, was among 1000 attendees at the Wounds Australia Conference 2024 held in the Gold Coast. At this conference a poster which Penny had produced was shown. This poster came about after Penny in her role, was managing a large complicated skin tear in a patient's lower leg. The patient had declined any hospital involvement and asked that Inglewood District Health care for them. With the patient's agreement, for Penny's own professional development, she decided to do a case study of the management of the wound which resulted in a successful outcome. Penny documented over 124 days the progress of the treatment including digital images. A wound community representative, whose products Penny was using, suggested that it all be collated and made into a poster and to apply for inclusion of it at the Australian conference.

Penny attended the conference and said the networking was very valuable and she spent some time with the Vice President of Wound Care NZ and visited many of the 62 trade exhibits. The Global company which supplied Penny with the wound dressings, has asked if they could use and reference the case study in future marketing, materials and presentations. This is a huge accolade for Penny and her work and she is to be congratulated and it certainly shows the calibre of the nursing done by the team.

The area around which Inglewood town, south to Tariki Road, Raupoko, Tarata/Purangi, Waitui/Karaita, Waingana, and north as far as the Waiwhakaioa Bridge at Egnott Village. Currently the Health Trust has three full time nurses and four casuals offering free comprehensive medical and nursing support for residents of Inglewood and surrounding districts and also 24 hour palliative care.
