

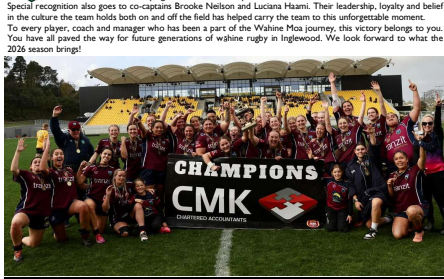
Wahine Moa Make History With Premiership Win

Durham WI News (Christine Fie Parlick)

Considering what an absolutely atrocious atmospheric river event was taking place (Thursday 27), our lucky Moa Mail 'braved the glacial conditions. It was pleasantly refreshing to have young Jess attend with her Great Aunt. Our roll call was to wear what we had on when our nominated person rang them. I do have photos, but had to promise not to share them in the Moa Mail. Rebecca Kennedy, a 56 John Community Educator was our excellent guest speaker and demonstrated the use of an AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) using a training AED. Rebecca stressed how crucial it is to start CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) immediately when the patient is unresponsive and not breathing normally. The patients' chances of survival are directly related to how soon chest compressions begin. Call 111 first if you are able to and have your phone beside you on speaker so you can receive support until help arrives. When we practiced doing CPR it was jolly hard work but great at warming us up. "Push on the chest Hard and Fast", "30 to 2 no matter who!" These are the mantras for all age groups. Although of course, under eights and babies require less pressure. If you don't feel comfortable doing mouth to mouth, just do the chest compressions until the ambulance arrives.

There are some handy apps you can put on your phone for medical emergencies, including CPR and AED (which shows you where AEDs are located). We heard about Good Samaritan, which alerts up to six trained volunteer Good Samaritans within a 1 km radius in town and 5 km in rural areas, one of who may be able to arrive before an ambulance can get there to provide valuable lifesaving first aid. Look online to investigate first aid courses in your area. A welcome cuppa and goodies were shared, competitions judged, formal meeting completed and the dash for home still with the rain unleashing. It might be winter.

Congratulations to Ingwood's NZ Rugby Under 18 High Performance Players

Congratulations to these three young women, Te Wakaokau Matheson-Julian, Hayley Coogan and Kaylani Anaha, who all started their rugby careers playing junior rugby for Ingwood. They were selected to attend the New Zealand Rugby Under 18 girls high performance pathway programme at St Peter's School Cambridge in July. Fifty Under 18 women players were chosen to take part in a high-performance campaign. The performance group was split into two squads that played an inaugural U18 girls' North v South game on Friday 11 July at the culmination of the six day programme. The North squad selected from girls playing their rugby at a school or club within or north of the Provincial Union boundaries of East Coast, Bay of Plenty, King Country and Taranaki. The South squad from south of the Provincial Union (PU) boundaries of Whangaim, Hawke's Bay and Poverty Bay. Te Wakaokau Matheson-Julian now playing for Freyberg Old Boys Rugby Club, Hayley Coogan playing for Sacred Heart Girls College, and Kaylani Anaha playing for Manukura and Freyberg Old Boys Rugby Club.

NZ's Women's High Performance Pathways Manager Kendra Cockesidge said the campaigns was an exciting moment for women and girls' rugby.

"This will be the first time we've had a national U18 high performance camp, so it's a major development in the teenage girls' pathway. It's incredibly exciting to have the volume and quality of talent, and resources to enable the assembly of our top Under 18 talent."

"We've seen exponential growth in playing numbers in our schools and its crucial we provide these players with a springboard on their high-performance pathway. We want to equip these girls with the skills, knowledge, and experience to take the next step on their rugby journey."

Hammer

This month is still a great time to be planting winter veges including leafy greens and brassicas. Dig in Tui Compost and Tui Sheep Pellets before planting to replenish nutrients used by previous crops. You can plant beetroot, kohlrabi, choy, broad beans, brussels, cabbage, cavolo nero, coriander, dill, fennel, leek, mizuna, onions, shallots, parsley, peas, rocket, rosemary, sage, silverbeet, spinach and thyme. Lift and divide overcrowded asparagus beds and plant out new crowns. If you have broad beans - stake or support plants as they grow. Potatoes - now is the time to start planting potatoes ready for planting in August or September. Always choose certified seed potatoes, as these are specifically selected to thrive in the home garden and are guaranteed to be free of viruses and pests that affect potatoes. Prepare potato beds ready for planting by digging over the soil to a depth of 30cm. Next, add plenty of compost or Tui Sheep Pellets. Blend in Tui Potato Food to soil prior to planting. In the fruit garden it's all about preparing new season fruit trees and strawberries. Strawberry plants will be available now and to ensure a good strawberry crop the plants need to have a period of winter chilling. The cold temperature helps stimulate the flower buds which produce the fruit. Prepare beds by working soil over with a fork, blend in sheep pellets, a layer of Tui Strawberry Mix and Tui Strawberry Food prior to planting. There are many varieties of strawberries available on the market, so try something new, or stick to your favourite, either way, good preparation is key to having a lovely abundant crop. Watch out shortly for our in store pruning demonstration, where Karen will go through what you need, and how to prune, with best follow up care needed to make your plants the best they can be. Let's Grow Together

It is not new. In fact, the idea of sustainable food production is both inherent and intuitive within our farming community, yet it remains largely unknown to the broader public. This represents a missed opportunity for positive change. However, we can make progress by following the guidance of Catherine Miller from Kaitake Regional Leadership. Catherine has published an insightful study that serves as a blueprint for collaboration between governments and communities aimed at creating a sustainable local food supply. Her research highlights the personal experiences of individuals facing food insecurity and emphasises the importance of self-sufficiency skills, such as gardening and bartering, along with strong community networks. But they can't do it alone, or at best not without difficulty. And that's where the Government could step in. There are regulatory barriers that could be addressed by the government to facilitate this development. Some initiatives we could pursue, as recommended in Catherine's study, include:

1. Increasing access by modifying food safety regulations and reducing barriers for the cottage food industry.
2. Tightening regulations on processed foods high in sugar, salt, and saturated fats to reduce their availability and marketing - especially to children.
3. Establishing a national food strategy that enables and facilitates the development of opportunities for small landowners, and increasing participation in food production.
4. Utilising Puna farms to experiment with stacking enterprises that are suitable for the local area, identifying diversification opportunities for small landowners, and increasing participation in food production.

But it all still comes down to government (local and central), and communities working together to grow the concept. And I like to think we will, if we grow together.

St Andrews Restoration News (Graeme Sykes)

St Andrew's restoration team have now got final engineering plans. The estimate for the total build is \$3.1 million. We are currently submitting Resource Consent and Building permits with NPDC. The construction plan is to go in two stages. Stage One to strengthen and reroof the building, repair windows, doors and install new electrical fittings. Stage Two to complete the floor to suit existing and new community services. To call for Tenders and appoint a contractor for stage one we need to be very sure we have \$152,000 in the bank. We need to raise a further \$558,000 from the community. We expect a further two thirds of the cost will be raised from grants from various institutions.

Another Fund Raising Event: Live Music in Ingwood - Jonathan Harper with guest Mike Harding. Join us for an evening of original New Zealand folk music with Jonathan Harper, performing live at St Andrew's Church Hall, Inglewood on Friday, 8 August at 7.30pm. Featuring songs from his albums Vice of New Zealand, Pearls, Guitar Stories, and the brand-new Global Groove. His music carries the landscapes, people, and stories of Aotearoa.
