

Inglewood Lions Donation

Tuesday the 19th of August representatives of the Lions Club of Inglewood met with the members of the Taranaki Rescue Helicopter and Air Ambulance organisation to hand over the \$10,000 dollar donation the club agreed to give towards an on call staff facility that is being established at the New Plymouth airport for pilots and medics who are on call for the Rescue Helicopter and Air Ambulance service.

This new building is now complete and ready for transport from Manor Homes on Ocean View Parade Port Taranaki to its new home at the New Plymouth Airport. Finishing touches will be added to the building once it is on site, including a deck. The purpose built building includes an open planned living area, kitchen, laundry area and six ensuite bedrooms. Total cost of this project is approximately \$500,000 dollars.

We are looking forward to visiting the building once it is onsite and a finished product.

Sponsor plaques were considered for the rooms but as only the staff will see these maybe a sponsors sign outside could be a better option.
