Amber and Chris Brine, Phil Kulinski and Lahri Kulinski stood against elite athletes from around the world, showcasing not only their personal strength and discipline, but also the rising talent coming out of New Zealand. Months of intense training, strict nutrition and unwavering commitment paid off as they stepped onto one of bodybuilding's most iconic stages.

Amber Brine secured First place in her Professional Figure class - a well deserved result reflecting her hard work and dedication. Chris Brine delivered a strong performance, finishing with a very respectable Top Ten in the Men's Open Bodybuilding class while also coaching five athletes on the NZ team including Amber and Phil. Lahri Kulinski had a truly remarkable day taking First place in Junior Under 24 Bikini, then going on to win the Overall Bikini title resulting in her earning her Pro Card. Then placed forth in her professional debut just minutes later! Phil Kulinski brought home a win with First place in Masters Bodybuilding and his third Mr Universe title. Truly incredible!

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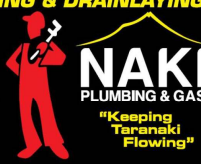

Closure of our local pool for winter has not dampened the competitive spirit of the Inglewood Swimming Club. Thanks to Taranaki Electricity Trust, funding a group of swimmers have been able to maintain training throughout the off-season at Waiti O Rua in Stratford across morning and evening sessions. This funding significantly lowers the cost for our swimmers and allows our competitive squad to keep building fitness and technique. Without it, momentum would be completely lost for winter.

Over Weekend, three swimmers travelled to Rotorua to compete in the Central North Island Showdown, a three-day event attracting over 100 swimmers. A tough three days of morning and afternoon sessions. This marks the first time in many years that the club has been represented at an out of region event, signalling a revival in the club's competitive programme. 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Polish Settlers Family Trees (Martha Szymanska)

50 years ago Polish Settlers celebrated 100 years since their families came to live in the bush that was known as Inglewood. Bena Kuklinski and Martha Szymanska began working on their family trees in 1975-4 and now at 96 years of age both women are still working on their family trees. Martha has rewritten hers and Bena is adding to her original tree keeping it together with lots of sellotape.

150 years ago the ship 'Priz' Reuter' sailed into Wellington on August 14th 1876 and some of those Polish immigrants boarded the steamship 'Taupo' and landed in New Plymouth of Taranaki. Some went to Hukiaia and others went to Jackson's Bay. Many of them later came to the Taranaki community where there was well paid work and land for sale. Strangely, Martha thought that Family trees belonged to Royalty, and did not know that a farmer on Durham Road could have a family tree.

"It's a privilege to take on this role as the Trust adopts the new Deed and looks ahead to how we can keep making a difference in our communities. I'm grateful to be part of a strong team of Trustees — there's a huge amount of experience and wisdom around the table," she said.
