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More Common-Sense from This Government

The New Zealand government's recent changes to earthquake-prone building rules are a refreshing practical, common-sense step in the right direction.

In the past, building owners everywhere no matter how risky their area actually was had to meet tough, expensive upgrade standards.

This put real financial stress on property owners, especially in low-risk places, and took attention and resources away from buildings that really needed work most.

The updated rules now focus on real, proven risks to public safety. Only buildings located in medium or high earthquake zones, or those that could genuinely endanger people, will be identified as earthquake-prone.

Conversely, large concrete buildings will undergo more targeted inspections, so owners aren't required to pay for expensive checks unless there's clear justification.

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The Mystery Christmas Tree

We have a Mystery Christmas Tree. We need the communities help as very little is known of its history, we would like to find out when it was last used, who built it, and where it stood. It was found in the back of a shed row used by Moratti Agri. It is quite large, made with light box section, decorated electric light bulbs. When erect it stands 3.5/4 metres high.

The shed was formerly part of the former Inglewood County Depot, so that is a start, secondly, on the Inglewood flagpole about four metres up there is a ring which perhaps may have been used to hold the tree in place.

As Inglewood doesn't have a Christmas tree, Inglewood Lions and Inglewood First would like to bring it back to life, and are investigating the possibilities of making it a Centre piece for Inglewood's Christmas season.

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Te Puāwaitanga o Te Kōhanga Moa Marae (Paul Adams)

Tānā kōwhiri, warm greetings to all. Many of you will have seen changes occurring recently at Te Kōhanga Moa Marae. In anticipation of a growing roll, Te Kōhanga Reo o Te Rangiora has had a major facade and extension. The Marae too has improvements underway. Due to the threat of storm damage, trees along the driveway were removed in 2023. St Patrick's Primary School's trees on the fence line pose a similar threat and will be removed and a new fence will be installed. Thanks to St Patrick's BOT for their support on these items. Refurbishment of the old building known as Te Wharehou (The New house), has started. The committee realised that if improved, it could be a great asset for the district. It may be very useful in the event of a Civil Emergency, but it could also extend the possibilities for the wider whānau and community. Until recently the Medieval School has been used and it made a start on improving the building. So far, improvements include, new wiring, a relocated and new main switchboard, new lights, new double glazed doors and a relocated access ramp with a new shelter portacalcove at the main door.

Thanks to Paul Edwards of KODIA Construction, Bevan Ogilvy Builder and Bryce Collins Electrical for their input. More work is planned. TET Stadium and Events Centre News (Hayley Duggan)

The Taranaki Community Stadium Trust is thrilled to announce significant funding from the Taranaki Electricity Trust (TET) towards the new Changing Rooms Project at Carnival Park. This is a major step forward for a project several years in the making. Working with Shelley Taranaki and Gareth from Paradigm Studios the last two years, we've created a design that's both to last and kept simple while delivering what our community needs most.

Carnival Park, right next to the TET Stadium and Events Centre, hosts dozens of school, sport, and regional events each year, yet currently has only one toilet and no shelter. The new facility will include four changing rooms, an open breakout space, and extra storage, creating a safer, more functional space for players, referees, coaches, officials and volunteers.

TET Stadium Inglewood are among only a few facilities in New Zealand with an all-weather school, grandstand, event centre, and five surrounding fields - hosting events like the Colgate Games, Rugby League tournaments, and the NZ Pipe Band Championships.
