Garden Clues with Sue

March is the perfect month to refresh your veggie patch as the soil is still warm, helping autumn crops establish quickly. While everyone is feeling the economic pressures on the bank balance, turning to other options like growing your own is one of the easiest ways to trim grocery bills. Cool-season staples like broccoli, cabbage, silverbeet, carrots, lettuce and spring onions provide continuous harvests at a fraction of supermarket prices.

Mid-March is also ideal for sowing coriander, beetroot, radish and leafy greens, which thrive as temperatures cool. Many of these crops mature quickly, meaning you'll see returns within weeks. Radishes, for example, can be ready in as little as five weeks. To maximise savings, replenish tired summer soil with compost and mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds. Healthy soil means faster growth and fewer losses. A few seeds now can fill your kitchen with fresh, homegrown produce right through winter—good for the wallet and the planet! Happy Gardening!


