well-drained soil. If your soil is heavy or dry and sandy, mix through west-rained soil. If you'r soil is neavy or any and sainly, misk unrough some compost or well-noted organic material. Adding blood and bone or bulb food can be beneficial if your soil is lacking nutrients. In heavy clay soils where draining is poor, or where roots from surrounding trees and shrubs are a problem, plant bulbs in raised beds. Adding sand to the planting hole will improve its drainage. Rule of thumb: plant bulbs twice as deep as their width (if a bulb is 4cm wide, plant it to a depth of 8cm - to the top of the bulb). If the

## Purangi Kiwi and Kokako Project (Karen Schumacher)

You may have noticed that our project title has Kolako included. After eight years of work and waiting we were finally advised last year that there were Kolako birds available and our permit was approved. Unfortunately, there was no catchers available! Another year has passed and with every finger crossed we are working on releasing the first of our Kolako in a few weeks.

This would not have been possible without the support of Methanex, both the company and the staff have been fantastic with their support, and together we will establish a breeding population over the next three years.

Our first Kokako are coming from Hauturu Island (Little Barrier Island). It has

reated a huge logistical exercise, catchers getting to the island, birds being elicoptered off and to the Auckland airport, flown to New Plymouth, then ansported to Purangi. It is planned to bring 20 birds down which will help transported to Furangi, it is planned to bring 20 birds down which will neligible them settle as they like to have other kolacils for company. 
