Gardening with Sue from Hammer

If you read Garden Clues last issue, you will be aware that Inglewood will have its first ever Harvest Festival, kindly brought to you by Inglewood First. It will be an amazing day, but there is preparation to be done now! One part of that Harvest Festival, is our own Giant Pumpkin Growing competition, which we hope our great local community will really get in on the action. So what do you need to do? Simply come in next week, from Tuesday 14 October, register your details, and pick up your FREE... yes that's right... your FREE Atlantic Giant Pumpkin seedling. There will be a limited number of FREE plants, so it will be first in, first served, as the saying goes, so don't delay, you'll want to get them in the ground as soon as you can. Let's quickly look at the first step, placement of our plant to get the best out of it.

So where should you plant... Pumpkins need to grow in full sun. Select a site for your pumpkin patch that receives as much sunshine as possible. As with any garden vegetable, the more sun the better. You want to provide the leaves with maximum sunshine. The object is to help maximize the photosynthesis process, and therefore, produce the largest plants and fruit. Secondly, it helps keep the plant leaves drier earlier in the day and later at night, minimizing the time that moisture and dew is on the leaves. In sultry summer nights, this moisture can promote plant disease, a real danger to your crop. One of the greatest assets for your pumpkin patch, is the existence of a high water table. The roots will dig deeply into the soil and the rich soil you have provided it. Those deep roots are seeing an abundance of water and nutrients, and even now, keep the spot, and start laying down a nutrient dense bed for your seedling. It is also important to keep in mind the basic principles of crop rotation. Whenever possible, you should not grow a crop in the same location two years in a row. This applies to all crops. Pumpkins are no exception. Crops deplete certain minerals in the soil. By planting different crops, you minimize this problem. Some of these tips are also what we should be doing in our normal vegetable gardens, so let's learn along the way. Don't forget to register, and we'll see you next week once the Giants have arrived in store. Happy Gardening!

Inglewood First September IAS

Richard Jordan related how and why the museum was set up. In 1992 meetings were held to discuss how to put Inglewood back on the map and entice travellers to stop and enjoy our town. The Inglewood Development Trust was formed along with Mainstreet, Trans Crossroads Promotions, now Inglewood First and in 1995 a redevelopment of the town centre was planned, buildings to be painted in heritage colours, plans were put in place for paving, landscaping, street lighting and Friz Reuter Place was developed along with the Village Green on the Railway Land. While the 'Village Green' is not yet achieved, the rest was. If travellers were going to stop in the town there needed to be a reason, a point of difference. Inglewood's point of difference was Fun Ho! Toys, a national toy store, which had been manufactured at Underwoods in Inglewood for several decades. Barry Young had a large collection of the toys in a small museum at the old Underwood factory. The Trust purchased the collection and it was relocated to the former Inglewood Post Office building purchased with help from the Taranaki Electricity Trust. The local community and businesses fully supported the project, fitting out the new museum. Fun Ho! Toys are made on site in a foundry using the original moulds and furnaces. These toys are sold all around the world and to kindergartens across New Zealand and can also be purchased in the museum shop. Over 15,000 people visit the complex annually, a great way to get people to stop instead of just passing through. In 2010 the local paper, the 'Moa Mail', began production. Produced and printed on site with 2850 copies being distributed to the town and rural areas fortnightly.
