NPDC is spending more than \$44 million over the next 10 years to improve the district's water networks and Inglewood is the first cab off the rank. A project is due to start in Inglewood, where a quarter of the town's pipes will be replaced over the next three years.

NPDC will be investing about \$2.5 million in Inglewood's about seven kilometres of pipes. We look after more than 800 kilometres of water pipes throughout the district and they range in age from more than 110 years old, so it's great this important piece of work is under way," says Mayor Neil Holdom.

"Improving the quality and performance of our community infrastructure is a major focus for this Council. We have an obligation to provide a consistently high standard of services to our people and we are investing significantly to ensure our water networks meet the needs of current and future generations."

The first phase of the work is to replace the old pipes in the Inglewood urban area which will be followed by replacing the main pipes that connect the town to the reservoir. The project is expected to alleviate occasional issues with discoloured water.

The pipes will be made from PVC, a durable pipe that is common throughout New Zealand and is suitable for Inglewood's local conditions. NPDC will be on the streets of Inglewood talking to locals about the details and we thank them in advance for their support. Gardening with Sue from Hammer (Sue Marsh)

Well, the last fortnight's weather has certainly been a mixed one, and it certainly has been a while since we have had to light the log fire here in November, very chilly. We have had some lovely rain, in the last few days, and it has done wonders for the garden, and it makes us realise, how important water is to our growing gardens. The roses are full of bud, and about to start flowering, so keep vigilant, and keep up your plant's health maintenance, and watch out for pesky aphids, that just love that fresh growth. They certainly look beautiful at this time of the season, that first flush of flowers, is always the best. There seems to be a problem with shrubs, which causes the silencing of leaves especially noticeable on rhododendrons. Thrrips are little leaf sucking bugs, that are controlled by using a systemic insecticide, that the plant absorbs. Normally spray mid-November, early January and late Feb, and try Neem oil if you prefer. If you choose not to spray, this year they may look silver, but next year you may not have a problem. Definitely don't pull your plants out! The veg garden is humming along, and there is plenty of choice, and all vegetables can be planted now. I'm sure we are past the coolest nights, fingers crossed. Fresh is always best, so keep regular sowings up, as space becomes available, so you can harvest continuously. So now's your chance to get your plants really growing yet, but it will be fast getting its roots established. Checked mine the other day, and was very pleased it had the protection from the southerly wind, and hadn't blown out of the ground! I have surrounded mine with black weedmat, hoping to keep the weeds away, give it warmth, and protection from drying winds. Watch this space, happy gardening!

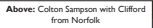

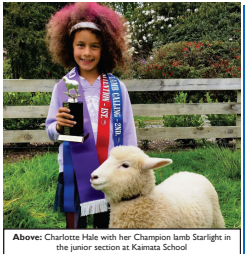

Kiwi Month, Royalty and More

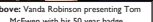
