It is great gardening weather at present, and now is the time to get everything planted, whether you are into your vegetables, or prefer flowers, there is just so much choice available.

In the flower garden, fill up those gaps by planting perennials, such as penstems, osteospermums, daisies, and plenty of little shrubs also fit the bill. They give you colour, they certainly fill gaps, and most of them have a long flowering period, which is perfect, as all you need to do is a little deadheading here, a little feeding there, and make sure they have sufficient water in dry conditions, and you will be very happy! All vegetables can be grown very easily around here, and if you have only a one metre x one metre raised garden, then you can still have delicious fresh vegetables, picked straight from the garden. If this is all the room you have, then try radishes, spring onions, lettuce, dwarf beans, maybe a few peas, and with the addition of simple bamboo tee-pees, or a little netting stretched out up the side, then you should fit quite a few veges in the space. This method of gardening is called the square foot garden, and you can have some real fun with it.

How are your pumpkins coming along, make sure you give them plenty of water, and as they really start growing, you are going to need to feed them. Like us, we need food to keep on going, and so do your plants, but even more, so does your Giant Pumpkin. As they get bigger, you may have to protect them from harsh winds, their leaves can get quite large, and may get picked up by the wind. Well plenty to do in that garden, so happy gardening!
