Experience Purangi News - Mustelid Identification (Karen Morant)

Those pesky predators may not be seen but they could be there in your backyard. A drawcard is your compost heap and if you have chooks or rabbits these are also known to attract stoats and weasels.

Visitors into the office often ask what the difference is between stoats, weasels and ferrets. In comparison there is many more stoats around than their much larger partner in crime - the ferret. Stoats are identified by their longer tail with a black tip.

DOCCO20 Boxes are good for both stoats and rats and if you have both can be targeted with some mustelid lure. Weasels are attracted to fresh meat. If there is mainly an issue with rats - good old fashioned peanut butter on a T-Rex rat trap in the Urban trap box can do the trick sufficiently well.

Changing the bait is a good idea and if you feel you are able to part with some of your chocolate bar, they are partial to the flavour. Whittakers or Cadbury? - You will have to report back which they prefer.

Gardening with Clueless

Planting Strawberries.

Now is a great time to plant your strawberries for this coming summer. If you prepare your soil well the better your plants will grow. Adding a layer of Strawberry mix specifically formulated with extra potassium will encourage a plentiful harvest of big juicy fruit.

Rule of thumb is to plant five strawberry plants for each member of the household. Planting now might produce a larger crop over the season. Full sun is recommended when planting and making mounds about 10cm high for the plants to be planted on improves drainage and increases air circulation around plants.

When planting loosen the root ball of the plant, plant about 15cm apart on top of the mounds, press the soil around the base of plant and remember to water well.

Over time if you feed your strawberries hopefully they will give you a bumper crop, so replenishing nutrients is important. A specialised strawberry food will help with stronger plants and helps resist disease. Protecting your plants using straw can help keep the fruit off the soil while keeping the roots moist, it also helps with the weeds. Keep an eye out for the pesky insects and treat appropriately and when fruiting bird netting will keep those birds from stealing your yummy crop.

Barn Opening (Rosemary Oliver)

On June 28 about 50 people attended the opening of a new composting barn at John and Rosemary Oliver's Suffolk Road property. A barbecue lunch was sponsored by Azech Buildings. This was followed by presentations on the philosophy and value of the barn by John Oliver, Dr Neil Chesterton, Darryl NZ's Lauren McEldowney and the representatives from Azech. Neil Chesterton prayed for God's blessing on the barn and Rosemary Oliver cut the ribbon. This barn, which is 45 metres wide x 60 metres long, was supplied as a kasee from Azech in Hamilton and was built by Wells Building and Construction. The barn will be used for feeding supplement to the herd of 300 cows every day of the year. Some aims of the barn are to prevent pasture pugging during winter, to improve core health and production and to give cows shelter from wet weather and high summer temperatures. This was a significant occasion for the Oliver's farm operation, and marks the start of a new farming system for them. A feature of this barn is that the sawdust is aerated each day with a tractor in order to create an aerobic composting effect. There is expected to be no smell and no effluent discharge from the barn which makes it very environmentally friendly. The sawdust will stay in the barn for 1-2 years and then be spread around the farm as fertilizer thus reducing fertilizer costs significantly. Those who attended the opening were very interested and a good day was had by all.
