### Durham WI News (Christine Fitz Patrick)

Jill Burge is Chair of New Plymouth Trade Aid and also their Education Officer. We were thrilled to welcome her as our guest speaker. Jill's association with Trade Aid began many years ago after she heard the quote "Give good gifts because good gifts give" in a radio advertisement. This led her to become a volunteer in the Trade Aid shop.

Her visit to us was thought provoking with moving stories of the people and communities she engaged with on a self-funded trip with ten others this year. From the poorest parts of urban Calcutta to remote rural villages in Sri Lanka, they travelled to meet some of the producers who supply the 28 New Zealand Trade Aid Stores.

Most of us have made purchases from Trade Aid shops but I for one have never thought about the impact that has on the lives of others. Jill told us about the struggles of some of the many talented artists and how those communities in turn are able to look after their often disabled or disadvantaged crafts people in return. Consider that in Sri Lanka the retirement age for women is 50 and \$5 for men but there is no pension! Those who are able to remain independent in their own homes rather than relying on their children are fortunate indeed.

Trade Aid's Fair Trade business model is a social enterprise that is proud to assist in practical ways such as providing solar powered electric fences to prevent the elephants from trampling the chili fields and devouring the rice crops which means less people are killed by elephants. Improving lives and offering opportunities is an integral part of Trade Aid. It was also surprising to learn that Trade Aid is New Zealand's largest importer of fair trade coffee. We were able to examine closely examples of amazing cards, beautiful fabrics, wooden toys, puzzles, candles, aromatic spices, fair trade chocolate and other handmade wares that are available.
