**HAMMER HARDWARE**

Just one more week of winter to go. Spring is just around the corner, and already the days are drawing out. So this week, just wanted to go over, how we prepare our seed potatoes after purchase, so that we get the best crop we can when planting.

After you choose which potatoes you are going to grow, only buy certified seed potatoes, then spread them out in a dry area to allow sprouts to develop approx. 1-2cm in length. Lay them out on old newspapers, sackings, even clean dry seed trays, and before you know it, they will send new sprouts up. When ready to plant, dig rows approximately 15cm deep, and apply high grade potato fertiliser, and mix in well, so the potato is protected from fertiliser burning.

Place your sprouted seed potatoes 25cm apart in the row, make sure you have the sprouts pointing upwards. Carefully cover with soil, making sure you don't break the sprouts off. As the potato grows, start moulding soil around potato plants when they are 5-10cm in height. This protects them from going green and insect damage, and is very important. You can add another side dressing of your potato fertiliser, water regularly to keep soil moist and free from weeds.

There are so many choices, and from the 'early harvest' varieties, you can be eating potatoes 60-70 days from planting. So for your new season's potatoes, one of the most versatile vegetables around, the hardest thing will be deciding which ones you want to try this year. While you choose, also pick up some Bone Flour, a great food for your bulbs that helps with colour and plant health, just apply a light sprinkling around your bulbs as they appear. Try Dried Blood fertiliser, high in organic nitrogen and iron. Dried Blood is great for leafy crops like vegetables and flowering polyanthus, primula's cyclamen and other winter flowering plants. Plenty to do so, happy gardening!
