St Andrews Anglican Church To Be Closed (Kevin Rowan)

Parishioners of St Andrews learnt just prior to Christmas that the church building has been assessed as an earthquake risk. The detailed seismic assessment report, which has been three years in preparation, was received at

The church was designed by Messenger, Griffiths and Taylor of New Plymouth and built by Mr A O Brown of Wanganui. The cost was slightly under £3,300. This was the second Anglican Church to be

built in Inglewood. The first opened on October 16th, 1877, wooden building designed by Archdeacon Walsh, the then vicar o Waitara. It was situated in Cutfield Street and at some stage was doubled in size and a bell-rower added in 1918 the church and the vacuores in size and a pen-crower added. In 1918 the church and the victirage were moved to the present size on Rats Street.
