In an unusual twist, when the community should have been host. Community Board Chairperson Jean Pierce finished up her 24 years by throwing the biggest party seen in Ingwood for many years. With the aid of funding from the TET and Greymouth Petroleum, Jean and a great bunch of helpers really turned it on for the 150 or so guests representing all the volunteer service groups such as Fire Brigade, Red Cross, St. Johns, Lions, Rotary, etc, who tirelessly support our community.  
The Town Hall refit has been one of major fund raising efforts during Jean's tenure. It has never looked better, with the newly painted exterior setting the tone for the next 100 years, while the stage floor lighting brought back memories of past historic occasions, such as Queen Carnivals, Debutante Balls, School Jubilees, and so on. Jean and her team of friends and family members had set the scene with 4 rows of tables where each group were seated together, which created a convivial atmosphere from the start.  
A nostalgic touch was the use of Nelsons catering equipment on the tables, and current Nelsons 3<sup>rd</sup> generation owner Duncan and his team played a major role in preparing and cooking the main course, and then when the Town Hall gas oven failed to cooperate, Duncan arranged for the meat to be taken back over to the bakery ovens for reheating. The Durham Women's Institute, led by Karen Smith were responsible for the final preparation and service of the meal which included preparation of the delicious dessert, ably assisted by the Kaimata Playgroup mothers and others, while fellow Community Board member Richard Jordan and a team of conscripts kept the refreshments flowing throughout the evening.  
Entertainment was provided by well known Anthony Jones, Peter Galvin on the piano accordion (and bag pipes), and Daniela Williams on the organ.

**Gardening Clues** (With Sue from Hammer)  
The soil is warming up and the sun is staying around longer. Everything is now coming to life for spring. This is a busy time for gardeners who will be sowing, planting and fertilising their edible gardens.  
Prepare the soil, giving all areas a good digging over. Fertilise and remove any winter weeds. Prepare pumpkin and squash areas by applying Tui Organic Compost and Tui Sheep Pellets into deep holes and fill with extra soil to make fertile trenches for the cucurbits to grow in.  
September is a busy month for seed sowing and planting. Stay on top of things by using your diary to note when seeds are planted. Sow a few lettuce seeds every couple of weeks for a continuous supply. Plant seeds for basil, borage, borage, chard, chives, coriander, dill, parsley and thyme. Plant more early potatoes now in a different row. Sow broad beans, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, capsicum, carrot, cauliflower, celery, eggplants, fennel, fennel, garlic, leek, onions, parsnip, peas, silver beet, spinach, tomatoes and turnip. Sow courgettes, cucumber and pumpkins outside and cover with a cloche.  
Towards the end of the month, if the weather remains warm, make a sowing of French, butter and runner beans.  
Take root cuttings of rhubarb now, rhubarb likes to be divided up to go on propagating more plants. Use well-established plants and plant these deep in the ground. Water well through the summer, apply liquid fertilisers to leafy plants as the spring growth comes through. Not too much though, as the plants are still busy utilizing the food stores from winter. Happy gardening.

**Supplements – Good or Bad?**  
(Kristy Gray)

Dietary supplementation is often necessary to overcome nutritional shortfalls we face as a result of nutrient-depleted soils, environmental toxins, processed foods, and various other factors. Chronic illnesses and some life-stages can require more nutrition at times, such as during pregnancy or chemotherapy treatment. This is where supplementation can be beneficial. Not all vitamins and dietary supplements are the same! Many brands contain artificial additives, synthetic, flow agents, chemical colourings, and even inhibition, chemical vitamin compounds that your body does not recognize as nutrients and cannot fully process. There is a big difference between the natural vitamins found in food and the synthetic vitamins added to many popular supplements. Whole-food based vitamins are uniquely bioavailable and occur naturally in foods, plants, and herbs. Nutrients they contain work synergistically to enhance their absorption. Synthetic vitamins are produced in a laboratory and may be derived from toxic sources such as petroleum. The body can often have problems recognising these substances as food, and therefore they aren't able to be used as nutrients, banned in many other countries. This will not benefit your health long term. Do your supplements contain magnesium stearate? Ascorbic acid? These are synthetic chemicals. Nearly all synthetic vitamin C supplements are derived from genetically modified corn which still has not been tested for human safety when consumed. Magnesium stearate is not a nutrient – it is added to raw materials of supplements as a flowing agent so the powders can travel through machinery without clogging it. Magnesium stearate converts to formaldehyde in the body which is cell toxic. Would you consider taking that everyday for your health? Sadly this is industry standard. The ideal is to look for supplements which are derived from real food or herb sources and which are excipient-free. In a future edition I'll explain how you can recognise these and make the most beneficial choices for you and your family.

In 1874 my Great Grandfather Domenico Moratti left his home nestled in the mountainous region of Lombardy, Italy to forge a new life in the promised land of New Zealand. He arrived aboard the "Reichtag" in Wellington, and after some time settled in Inglewood, working on the Railway line that was being built at the time.

For those of us who have been bitten by the family history bug, delving into past is an exciting journey.

This year a decision was made to return to his home town of Villa di Tirano, Italy and to spend an extended amount of time there immersing ourselves in the area, the culture, and to connect with where my ancestors originated.

So I asked for 6 months off work, rented out our house, booked our tickets... and here we are!

In an area that the majority do not speak English it has been a wonderful test of skills to communicate.... but after 3 weeks of verbal ear bashing, you do tend to start picking up the language easier!

It does make you stop and think – all those years ago in Inglewood, what it would have been like to hear 4 or 5 different languages of the settlers of the time: Italian, Dutch, Polish, German.... To sit in the church where my Great-Great Grandfather and Grandmother were married was a very special moment. The historic San Lorenzo Church (Chiesa) itself is wonderful to see in person with the ancient paintings and fixtures inside – we sat in awe for some time.

Finding out the history of the area and our family has not been without its challenges – emails not returned, the long wait for an appointment with the Director of the museum... I can only assume this is the Italian way – and we are now on Italian time!

So I patiently make my contacts and settle into the magic of the area and the Italian way of life... It does really feel like we are living the dream. (Oh, and Miles gets to climb all the hills – "win-win"!!)

Arrivederci!
